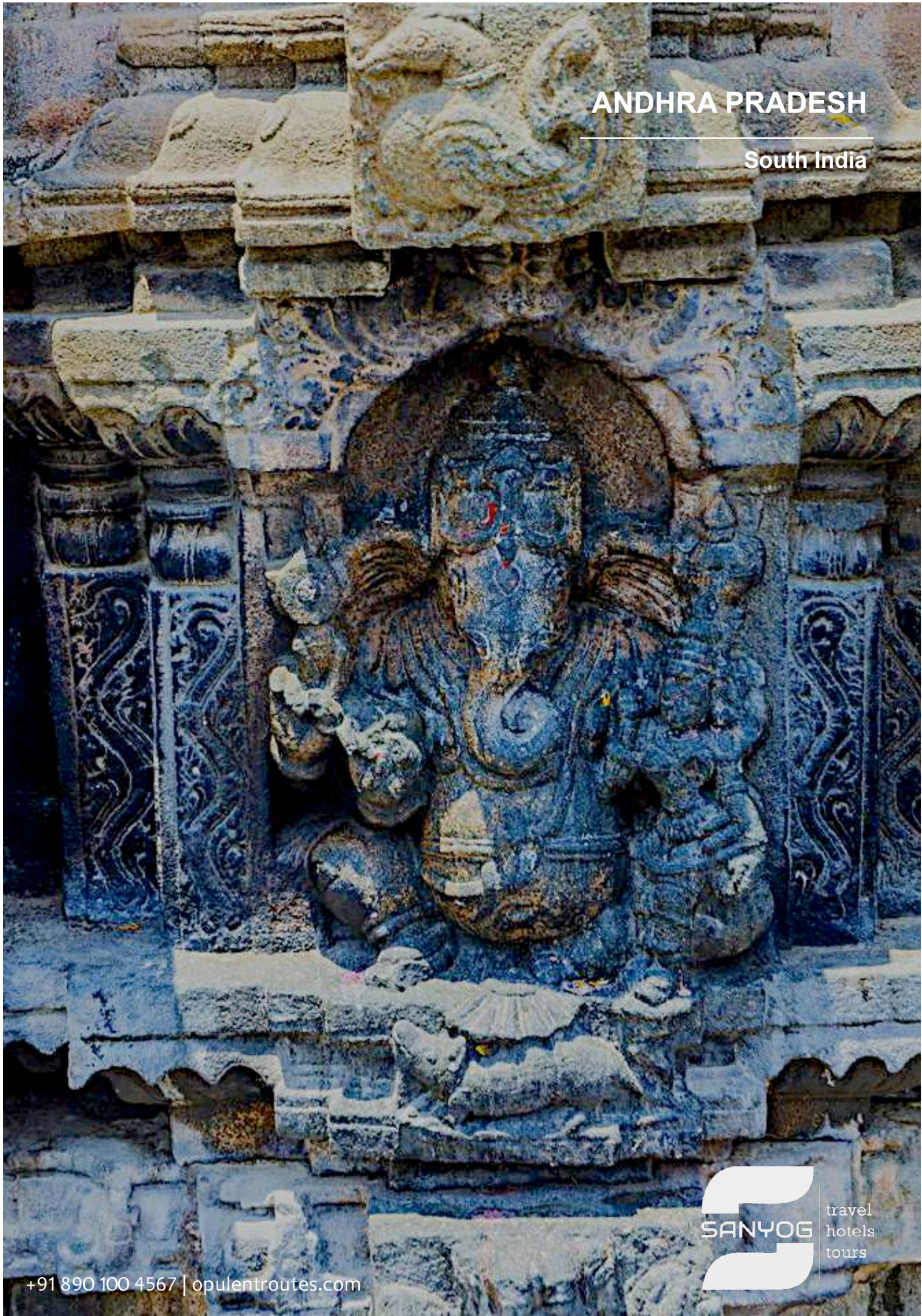

Weather

The weather of Andhra Pradesh is suitable for traveling. It may be a little hot and humid during the day but the temperature is not unbearable. The topography of Andhra Pradesh is extensive and quite diverse. The landscape includes hills, two rivers, Godavari and Krishna as well as other rivers like Tungabhadra and Pennar.

The three main regions of Andhra Pradesh are Kosta, Telangana and Rayalaseema. The coastal region receives more rainfall than the other regions. Apart from those areas lying close to the coast, other regions often suffer droughts.

Best Time to Visit

October to February is considered the best time to visit the place as the temperature remains somewhere around 16°C. It is an ideal time for sightseeing around the different destinations of the state.

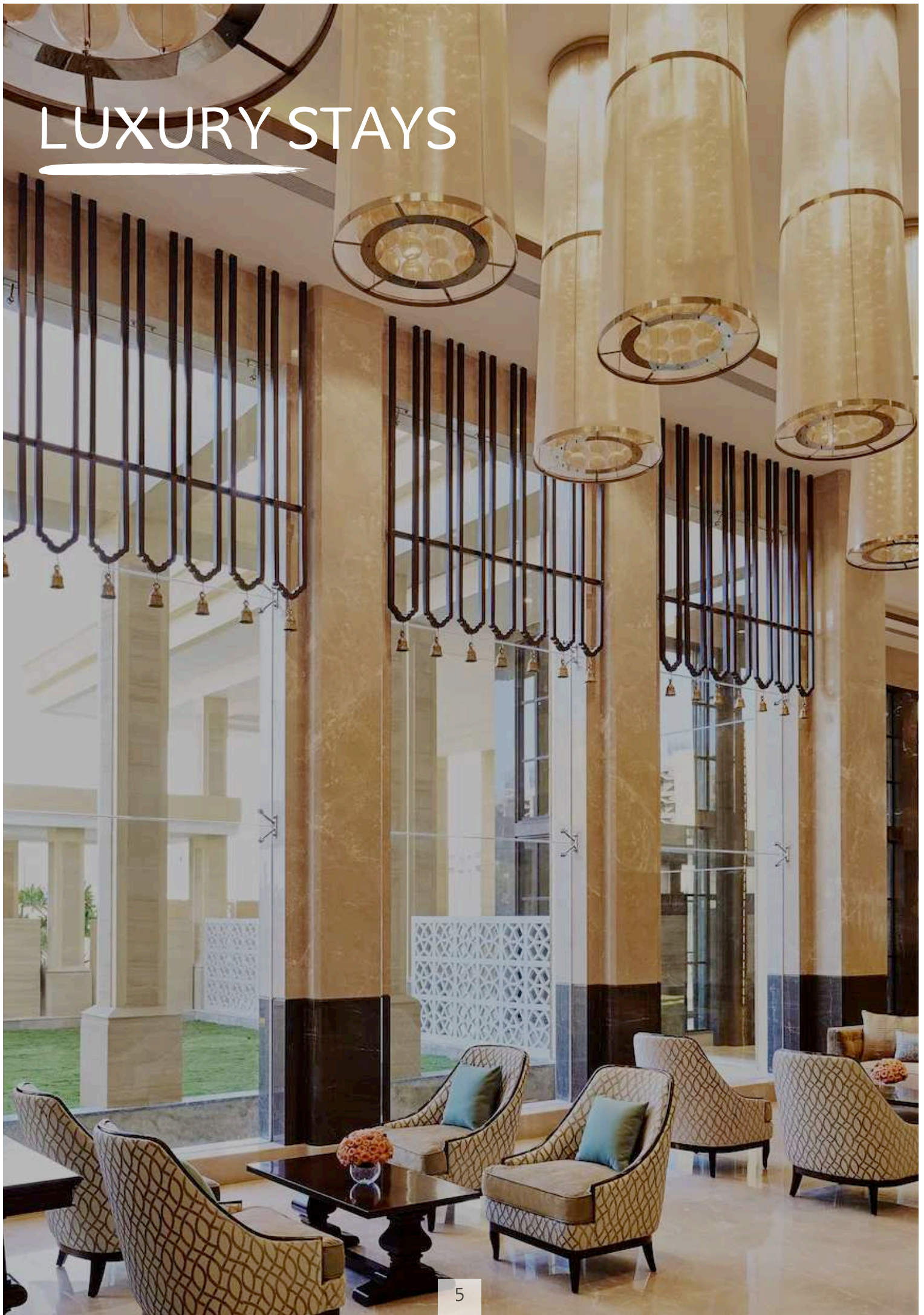
Folk Dance & Music

Language

In general, the state's various communities are identified more readily by a combination of language, religion, and social class or caste than they are by specific ethnic affiliation. Telugu is the official and most widely spoken language in the state. A small minority speaks Urdu, a language primarily of northern India and Pakistan. Most of the remaining groups speak border-area languages, including Hindi, Tamil, Kannada, Marathi, and Oriya.

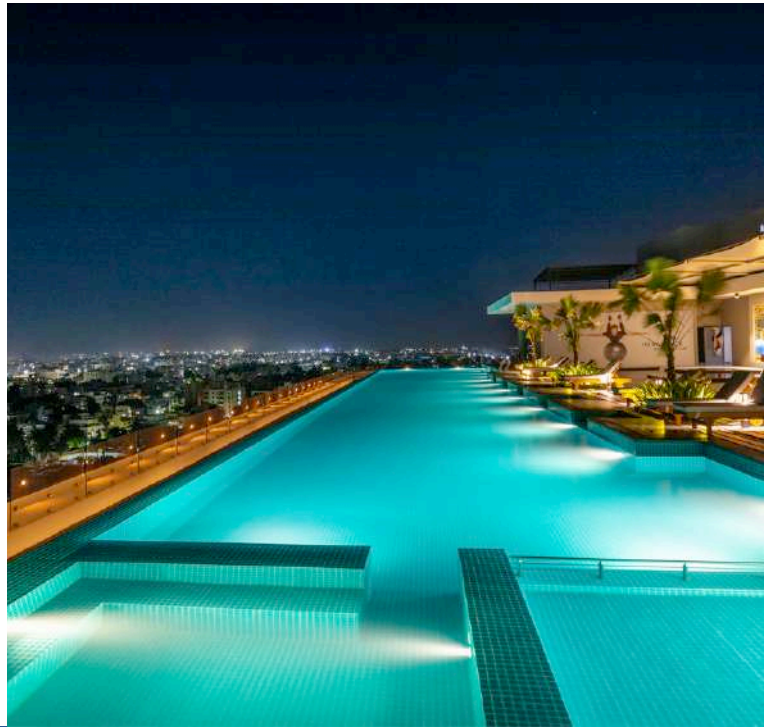




Amaravati - The Capital

Amaravathi has gathered attention from all over the world because of the Amareshwara Temple that is situated here. Amaravathi is also famous for being the site of the one of the greatest Buddhist Stupas ever built. This stupa is believed to have been built during the reign of Emperor Ashoka (269-232 BC) under Mauryan Empire.

It was in Amaravati that Lord Buddha preached and conducted the ceremony of Kalachakra. The proof of all this exists in the text of Vajrayana, which historically establishes the fact that Amaravati, was much in existence even during the 500 BCE.

Amaravati Archaeological Museum, Mangalagiri Temple, Amaravati Mahachaitya, Undavalli Caves, and Kondaveedu Fort are some of the popular places to visit in Amaravati.



The town gets its name from Amareshwara or Amaravati temple, dedicated to Lord Shiva. The town has been mentioned in the Indian epics as Dhanyakataka and Andhranagari. It was also served as the capital of the Satavahanas, who ruled Andhra Pradesh from the 2nd century BCE to the 3rd century CE.

Later it was ruled by several major dynasties like Andhra Ikshvakus, the Pallavas, the Cholas, the Kakatiyas, the Delhi Sultanate, Musunuri Nayaks, Bahmani Sultanate, Vijayanagara Empire, Sultanate of Golconda and Mughal Empire successively before the founding of the Nizam of Hyderabad in 1724. It was ceded to France in 1750 but was captured by England in 1759.

It was briefly captured by Hyder Ali, but remained under British rule for the majority of time since the 1780s. Amaravati is currently the de-facto capital of the state of Andhra Pradesh, following its bifurcation from Telangana in 2014.

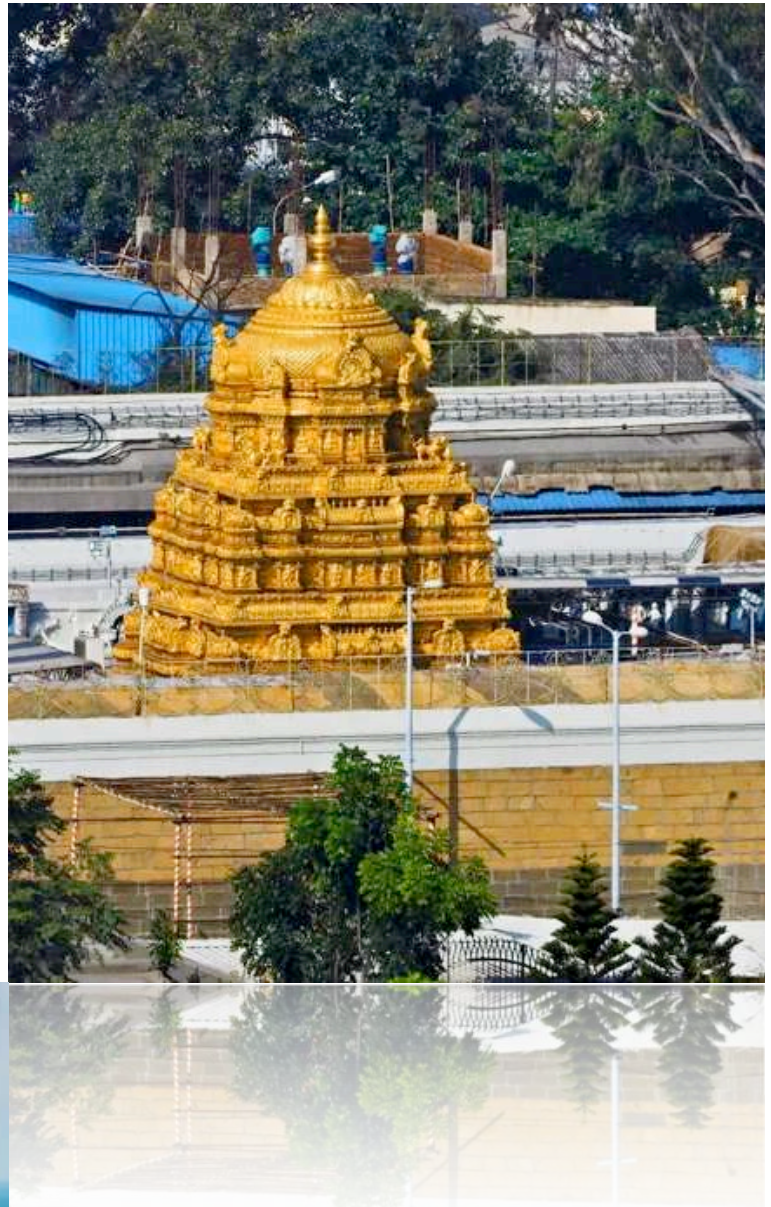

Tirupati

The city of Tirupati is famous for its legendary Venkateshwara temple located on the Tirumala hills. This temple in Tirupati is one of the most important shrines of the Hindus, making it a renowned place in Andhra Pradesh. The temple and the city get millions of devotees and travelers each year to seek blessings and witness this awe-inducing spirituality.

The city also has a national park where one can spot a lion and other wild animals. For the history buffs, there is also the Chandragiri Fort, built by the Vijayanagar emperors in the 11th century. Also, there are some cottages in Tirupati which are spectacular and attracts a lot of tourists who visit here.



Vizag

Also called by the name, 'Vishakapatnam', this is a coastal town also the industrial center of the state.

It has been acclaimed to be one of the best places in Andhra Pradesh for its striking infrastructure and clean coast. Ramakrishna Beach is one of the most renowned sights in the city. It is also the spot where the preserved submarine, INS Kursura is located.

The submarine now functions as a museum that highlights the life of the navy. One can also visit the Varaha Lakshi temple, indulge in some fantastic coastal food, and take a stroll on the



Araku Valley

The forest is home to some of the unique tribes seen in India and the government has taken extraordinary measures to preserve their indigenous ways of life.

There is a Padmapuram Garden atop the hill with a toy train, making this destination ideal for families with kids. This place is also home to a coffee museum, which is one of the highlights here.

Srisaillam

This town located in the Kurnool district is home to one of the Shakti Peethas of Goddess Parvati.

Moreover, it is an abode of one of the famous 12 Jyotirlingas that goes by the name Malikarjuna Jyotirlinga. The perfect setting of Srisaillam has attracted several tourists as it is nestled on the shore of River Krishna.

In addition, this hill town is identified with a famous dam and a wildlife sanctuary.

If you are the kind of person who looks for a quaint place to resort to then you must visit Srisaillam which is one of the best tourist places in Andhra Pradesh.



Papikondalu

Papi Kondalu is a breathtakingly beautiful hill range bounded by River Godavari in the state of Andhra Pradesh. Papi hills are a set of three hills which form a beautiful gorge on the Godavari River spread across East Godavari and West Godavari districts.

Entire area of Papi Kondalu is covered by tropical rain forests and it was recently declared as a protected National Park and is one of the top places to experience the Tourism in Andhra Pradesh.

The original name for this hill range was 'Papidi Kondalu'. Papidi is a rough translation for partition in Telugu. It is believed that the place was visited by Lord Rama and goddess Sita during their exile.



Ahobilam

Located at a distance of 340 kilometers from the city of Hyderabad, this is a lush-green spot, popular for hiking and a famous pilgrimage center.

The town has nine different temples where each form of Lord Narasimha is worshiped. This is the reason why the city is also called Nava Narasimha Kshetra.

Most of these temples are easy to walk up to but some of them are challenging hikes, which make it a place of interest for young travelers.

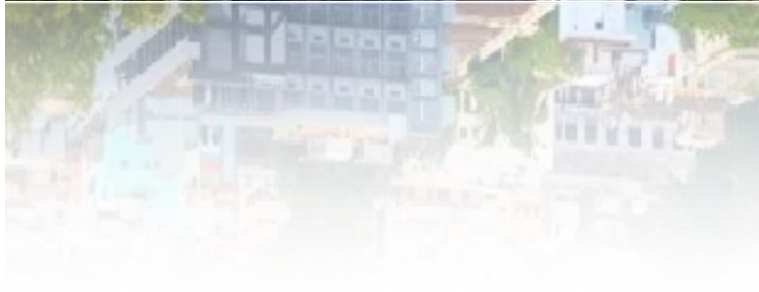


Vijayawada

The primary fascinations for the people here are the temples, Mutt, temple elephants and the chariots which are responsible for carrying the deity across the temple.



Srikalahasti

You might have heard of the famous temple which goes by the name Srikalahasti Temple.

This place is known for that temple which is why it receives a heavy footfall every year and has been listed in the best tourist places in Andhra Pradesh.

You will get to witness architectural marvels here and intricate carvings that add to the beauty of the extravagant shrines here. Apart from this, you will find several other places to visit like temples and waterfalls.



Nellore

Nestled on the banks of River Penna, Nellore derived its name from Nelluru. In Tamil, Nel means paddy and Ooru translates into place.

Nellore always had an upper hand in the agriculture sector as it is an exporter of rice, shrimp, prawns, and sugar cane.

Once you visit Nellore, you will realize that it is not a place that would disappoint anyone as there are several tourist places in Nellore like Ranganatha Temple, Mypadu Beach, Pulicat Lake, and Nelapattu Bird Sanctuary.



Chittoor

Heading to the next tourist attraction in Andhra Pradesh which is a package destination which not only offers some of the most religious places in India but also beautiful sceneries to relish.

Chittoor is a place that is dipped fully in religion but is also blessed with panoramic views and cascading waterfalls. You might not be aware of the fact that this place is also known as the Mango City due to a variety of mangoes available here.



Anantapur

If you are looking for a quaint place to resort then there cannot be a better option than Anantapura that is neither a city or a village. It is a town in transition which is why it is the perfect place to witness both the past and the future. Although the town is growing at a rapid pace, Anantapur holds to its traditions and glorious history.



Kurnool

Kurnool is also known as the “Gateway to Rayalaseema”, has many spots with historical importance. The biggest attraction is the Konda Reddy Fort, which is located at the heart of the city. The fort is only two kilometers away from the railway station and is a massive stone structure.

The town is famous for its unique spicy food that one can enjoy at any small-sized eatery across the city. The Sri Lakshmi Narasimha temple and the Dakshin Sai Baba temple are considered to be the most prominent pilgrimage sights here.



Kadapa

Kadapa literally means a ‘Gateway’. This name owes to its special location which acts as a gateway to the pilgrim spot of the Tirumala Hills.

The town was a part of the various ancient kingdoms of the South and it’s famous for its various temples and forts that exemplify a marvelous Dravidian style architecture and prowess of the artisans when it comes to stone carving.

The Bellum Caves are few of the longest caves in the Indian subcontinent and a spot that one shouldn’t miss. The town got its economic boom when the large deposits of natural Uranium were discovered here and is one of the world’s top 20 reserves of the nuclear fuel.

The Shree Venkateswara Wildlife Sanctuary located here is also a great spot worth visiting and is rich with flora, fauna and some breathtaking views.



Puttaparthi

The significance of Puttaparthi rose to fame due to it being one of the major religious centers of 'Sathya Sai Baba'. The various temples and socio cultural centers in the town attracted a majority of the tourist population and pilgrims. The town houses a no. of religious sites and temples popularized by Satya Sai.

The Chitravathi River is also referred as being the new Ganges and was used a cleansing spot for the pilgrims who visit here. One of the most distinctive places to visit here would be the Chaitanya Jyoti Museum which is a modern architectural marvel.

The museum combines a mix of Chinese, Thai, Japanese and Gothic style architecture into a single monument. The Sathya Sai Space Theater and planetarium is also worth visiting.

Rajahmundry

The city is known to be the cultural capital of Andhra Pradesh and is notable for its ancient Vedic culture. The city was said to have been founded by the Chalukyas in the 11th century.

However it has been disputed by many historians and archeologists who claim that the town existed before the rule of the Chalukyas. Rajahmundry is also known to be the birthplace of the Telugu language.

The river Godavari is the major attraction in this town and various parks and ghats are located by its banks. The boat cruises on the river are also an activity that shouldn't be missed.

The town being an ancient one is also famous for its ancient Dravidian Hindu temples that are frequented by tourists from all around.

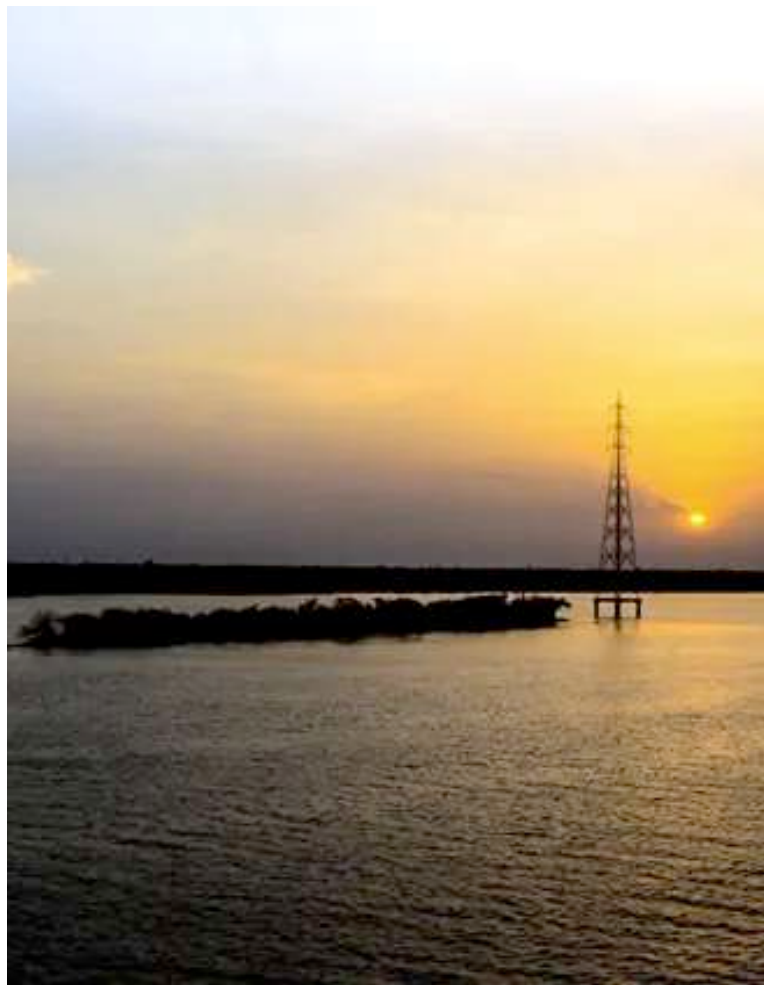


Amalapuram

A small town which is mainly known for its agricultural produce of coconuts and rice, Amalapuram has a rich Vedic culture and is known for its various temples.

While there isn't much to see in this town the main places to visit are the Appanapalli Temple, Ainavilli Siddhi Vinayaka Temple and Sree Veereswara Swamy Temple.

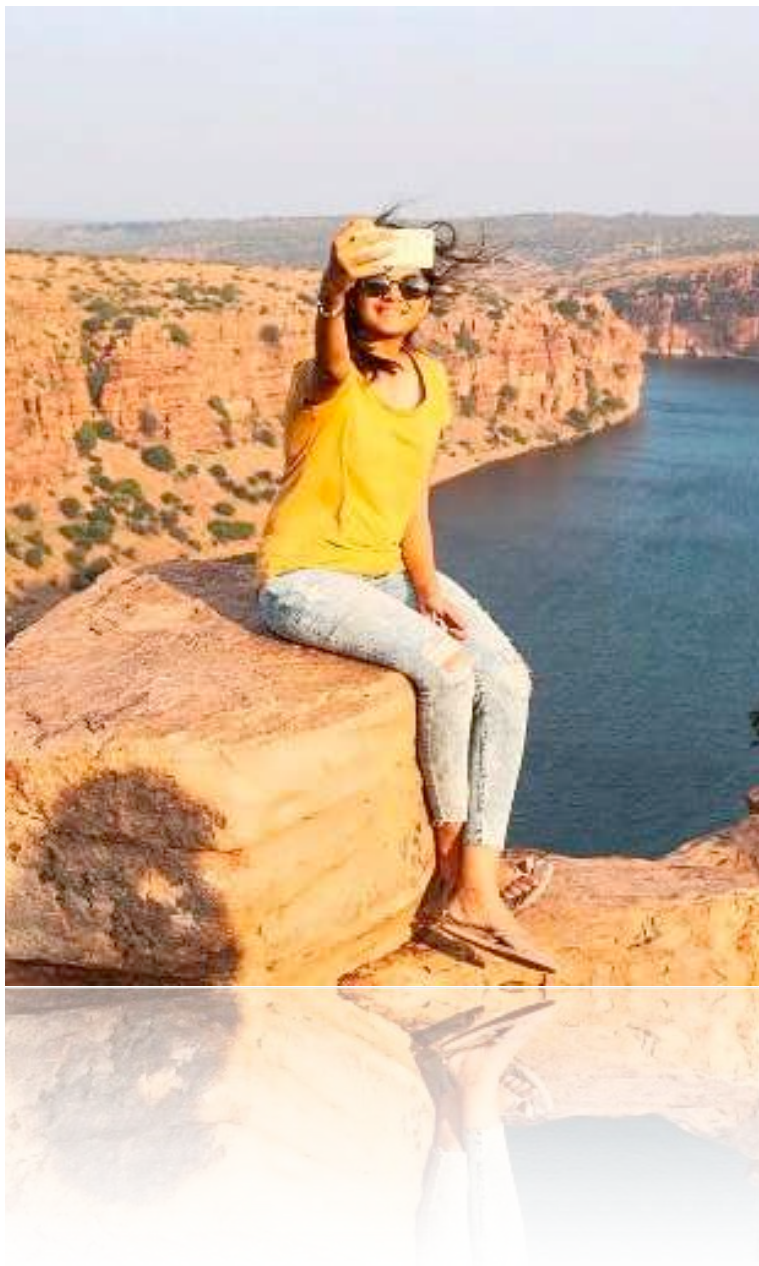
The town also lies at the head of the Konaseema Delta which is formed by the Godavari River. The town is also a hub of financial and education institutes in the Konaseema region.



Srikakulam

The town of Srikakulam is located at the banks of the Krishna River and is placed on the northeast corner of Andhra Pradesh. This town came under the kalinga region of ancient India and is known for its various ancient temples.

The town has one of the longest coastlines in the state of Andhra Pradesh and its various beaches are also worth visiting. Srikakulam is also a major producer of Khadi products. The various historic temples, monuments and beaches are deserving of a definitive visit.



Gandikota

Gandikota is a small village spread in and around the historical Gandikota Fort. According to history, Gandikota area was first identified and made Sand fort in 1123 CE by Kapa Raja of nearby Bommanapalle village and a subordinate of Ahavamalla Someswara I, the Western Chalukyan king of Kalyana.

The village transformed into major fort after the emergence of the Kamma kings, who ruled Gandikota more than 200 years. The fort fell into hands of Qutub Shahis of Golconda in 1650 CE. The medieval fort of Gandikota is named after the adjoining gorge which means gandi in Telugu. It is also believed that Vemana, the Telugu poet lived in Gandikota area for a short period.

Known to few ardent travelers, Gandikota is not the usual tourist hub as it is neither a world heritage site, nor is it marketed well by state tourism agencies.

Ahobilam

Located at a distance of 340 kilometers from the city of Hyderabad, this is a lush-green spot, popular for hiking and a famous pilgrimage center.

The town has nine different temples where each form of Lord Narasimha is worshiped. This is the reason why the city is also called Nava Narasimha Kshetra. Most of these temples are easy to walk up to but some of them are challenging hikes, which make it a place of interest for young travelers.



Lepakshi

One of the well-known tourist places in Andhra Pradesh, this site, however, gets more tourists from Karnataka than any other part of India because of its proximity to the state. This is a 15th Century town that was created by the Vijayanagar Kings. The temple of Veerabhadra at Lepakshi is known for its peculiar designs. The ceilings and walls have eccentric paintings and stunning pilers, which are sure to mesmerize you.



Nallamala Hills

Characterized as one of the most peaceful natural tourist spots in Andhra Pradesh, this hill station is an excellent place for a single-day trip or a weekend away from the bustling city. It is home to the Nallamala Forest, which is located on the beautiful Eastern Ghats. The weather here is very unpredictable but a visit to these hills will always be worthwhile.



Kakinada

Another one on the list of places to see in Andhra Pradesh is Kakinada which is a perfect amalgamation of the traditional world and modern lifestyle. You will be surprised to see how the place is growing with architectural gardens but is deeply rooted in its cultures. The city is packed with entertainment options like nightclubs and shopping malls. Moreover, adventure fanatics can also indulge in some water activities and explore the hidden treasures in the sea.



Machilipatnam

Counted among the top tourist places in South India, Machilipatnam is a port town nestled on the shores of River Krishna. The town is deeply rooted into its historical past along with which you can also witness the reminiscence of the time when britishers invaded the country. The town also offers some beautiful beaches to relax.



Konaseema

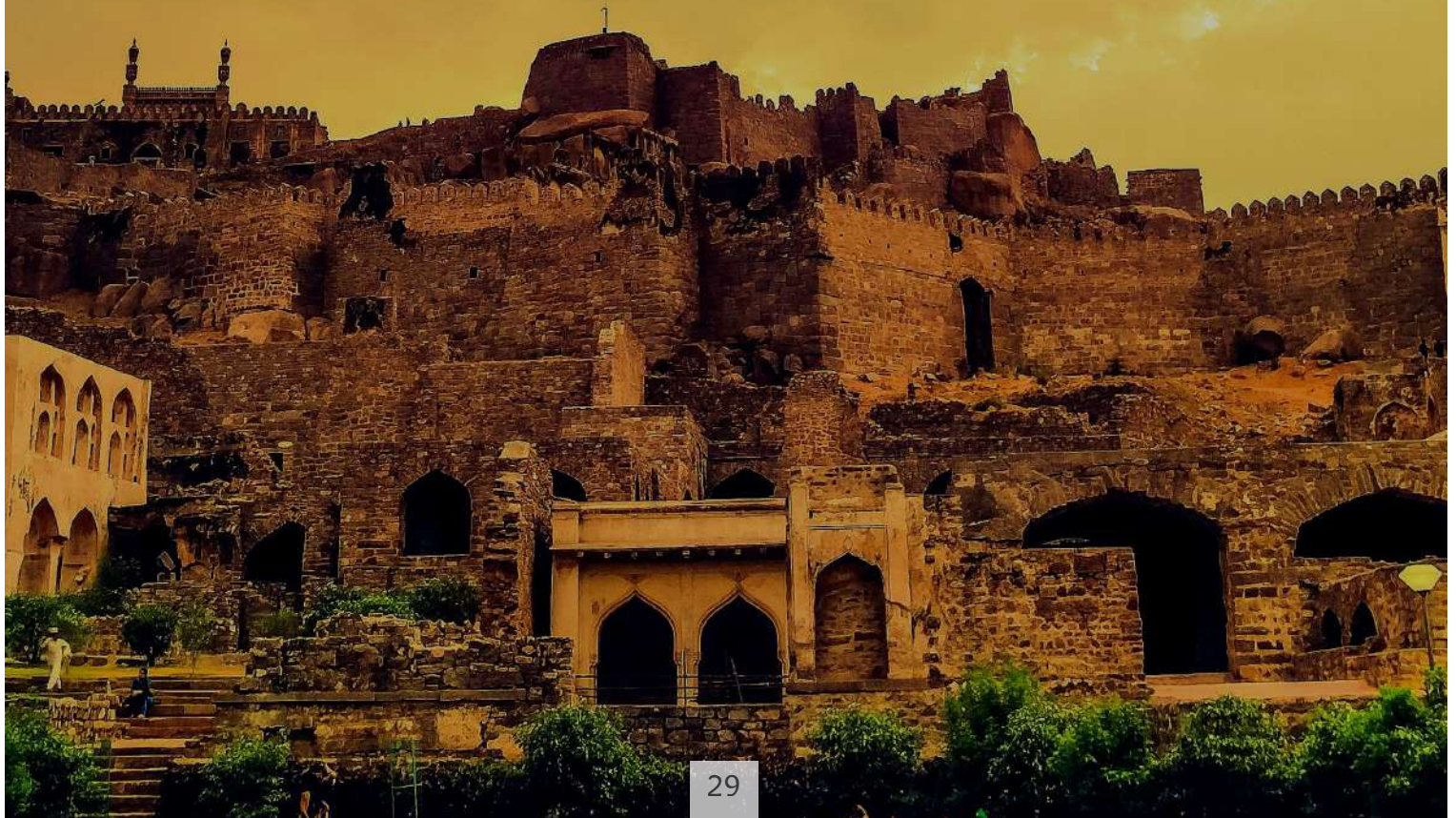

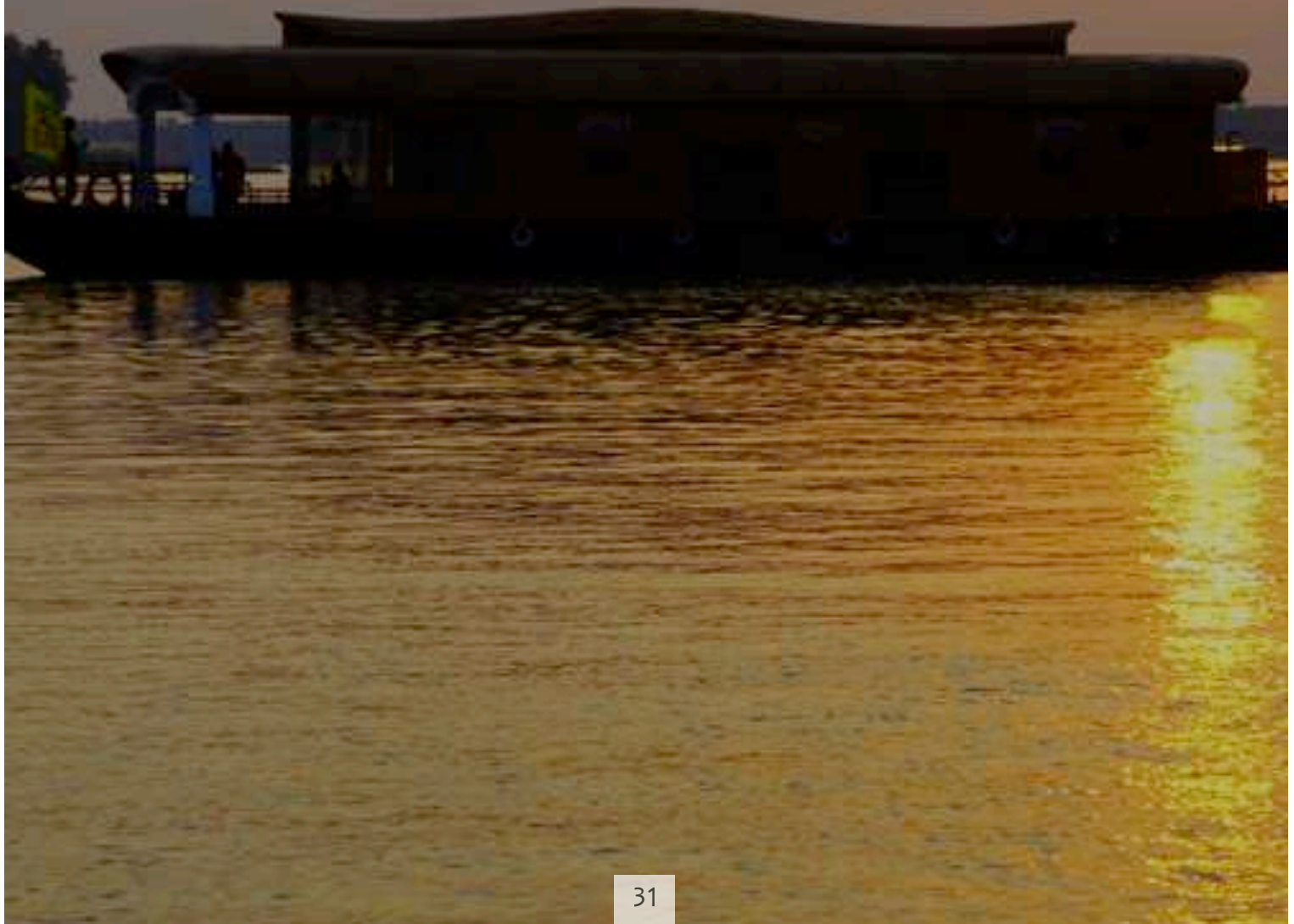

BOATING

The Paatala Ganga lake is the backwaters of the River Krishna and the level of water has been elevated since the construction of the Srisailem Dam for the power project in and around Andhra Pradesh. This lake is situated in the heart of Srisailem hills and Nallamalla forests. The ropeway is connected to reach this lake from the top of the hill to the lake.

The boating experience is not only about viewing the lake, the hosts actually enlighten people with the facts of Srisailem and the Paatala Ganga lake. They make you explore the whole waters of the Paatala Ganga Lake.

They explain you everything about the history of the place and the specialties of the lake. They say many thrilling and interesting stories, indeed facts, which makes visitors feel really excited about knowing about the place.

CUISINES

A food trail through Andhra Pradesh is bound to leave visitors salivating - not only due to the generous use of spice, but also because of the sensational blend of flavours that come together in this cuisine.

Cuisine of Andhra Pradesh is extremely popular among locals and tourists. The hot and spicy dishes are a speciality of the region. Mainly vegetarian dishes are served as part of the cuisine of the region. The uniqueness of Cuisine of Andhra Pradesh is that it is a blend of both Hindu as well as Muslim styles of cooking.

Rice is the staple food of the region. Sambar is a special kind of dal prepared in Andhra Pradesh. A traditional Andhra meal comprises five kinds of dishes. To cool the stomach after a spicy meal, curd is served at the end.

Some of the delicacies of Andhra Pradesh are Pulihara, Avakya, Upma and Bagara Baingan. Some of the famous desserts include Double-ka-Meetha, Dil-e-Firdaus and Ande-ka-Piyosi. Different kinds of fruits are often used in desserts.

A traditional Andhra Pradesh meal is served on a banana leaf. Pickles and chutney are important parts of a meal in Andhra Pradesh.

ADVENTURE



You won't be disappointed if some adventure is what you seek while visiting Andhra Pradesh in South India. It is home to a number of caves, which makes cave tourism an attractive option to check out during your trip.

Cave tourism in Andhra Pradesh should definitely include a visit to Mogalarajapuram Caves in Vijayawada, which are a protected monument of national importance, and famed as significant cave temples of Andhra, housing the idol of Ardhanareeswara which is not found anywhere else in South India.

The most popular caves in Andhra Pradesh are Borra Caves, Belum Caves and Mogalarajapuram Caves, which are located in Visakhapatnam, Kurnool and Vijayawada respectively.

Amongst these, the Belum Caves are considered the second longest caves in India and a must visit while exploring caves in Andhra Pradesh.

BEACHES

Andhra Pradesh, with its picturesque coastline of 970 square kilometers, finds a place on the list of best beach destinations in India. While taking a sightseeing tour of the state, tourists can visit the two popular beaches in Visakhapatnam, Rishikonda Beach and Rama Krishna Beach.

Your beach tour in Andhra Pradesh should also include a visit to the Yarada Beach, Gangavaram Beach and Dolphin's Nose. If you are a nature lover or a photographer, then these beaches, with their captivating sunsets and serene ambience, are exactly the place you should be.

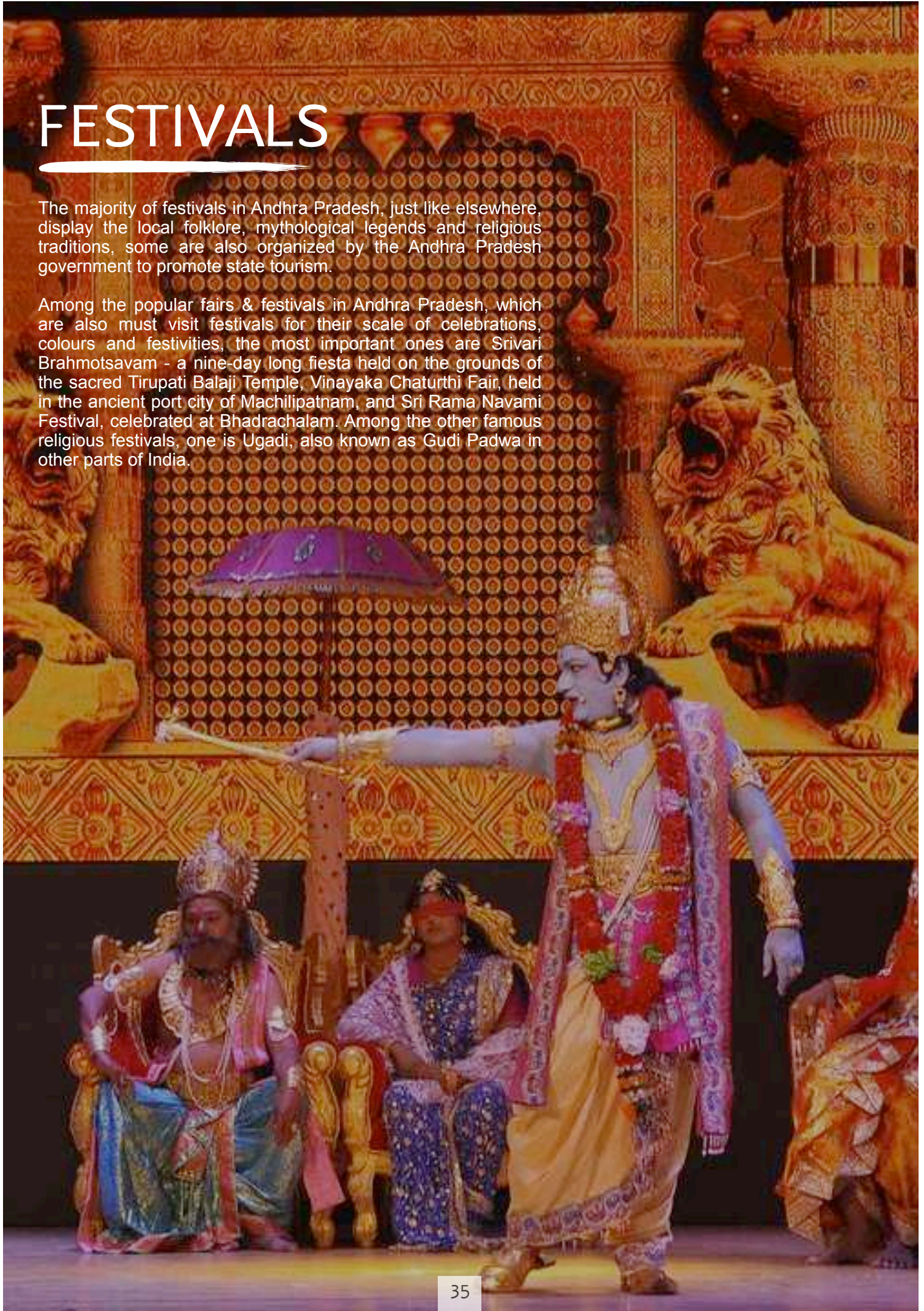
Other places that Andhra Pradesh has to offer in terms of beach tourism are the Bhavani Island in Vijayawada, Manginapudi in Machilipatnam and Mypadu Beach in Nellore. Baruva beach in Srikakulam district, Bheemunipatnam located about 20 kilometers from Visakhapatnam, Manginapudi about 75 kilometers from Vijayawada and Mypadu located about 25 kilometers from Nellore city, are other best beaches to visit in Andhra Pradesh.

Other beaches which you should visit while travelling to this fascinating South India state are Uppada, located about 5 kilometers from Kakinada town, Suryalanka, 50 kilometers from Guntur city and Vodarevu, located about 100 kilometers from Vijayawada.

FESTIVALS

The majority of festivals in Andhra Pradesh, just like elsewhere, display the local folklore, mythological legends and religious traditions, some are also organized by the Andhra Pradesh government to promote state tourism.

Among the popular fairs & festivals in Andhra Pradesh, which are also must visit festivals for their scale of celebrations, colours and festivities, the most important ones are Srivari Brahmotsavam - a nine-day long fiesta held on the grounds of the sacred Tirupati Balaji Temple, Vinayaka Chaturthi Fair, held in the ancient port city of Machilipatnam, and Sri Rama Navami Festival, celebrated at Bhadrachalam. Among the other famous religious festivals, one is Ugadi, also known as Gudi Padwa in other parts of India.

The state's 13 districts are spread across two unofficial regions – Coastal Andhra and Rayalaseema which is an astounding amalgamation of Colour, contrast and experience.

Call it an exquisite stopover for those seeking bliss and tranquillity. At heart, Andhra Pradesh is nothing but a glorious representation of India's ancient past.

WILDLIFE

Andhra Pradesh, in South India, boasts a rich biodiversity, and has a lot to offer in terms of wildlife tourism. Some of the best wildlife destinations to visit in Andhra Pradesh are the Kaundinya Wildlife Sanctuary, Indira Gandhi Zoological Park, and the famous of all, Nagarjuna Sagar – Srisaïlam Sanctuary, which is the third largest tiger reserve in India, spread across an area of 3,658 square kilometres along the Nallamala Hill Range of Eastern Ghats. Away from the Eastern Ghats, the deltaic region of Andhra Pradesh hosts an exceptional

The famous Coringa Wildlife Sanctuary is the habitat of more than 120 different kinds of birds, including the White-Backed Vulture, Oriental White Ibis, Painted Stork, Purple Heron and Spot-Billed Pelican.

This sanctuary finds an honourable mention in the wildlife tourism of Andhra Pradesh because of its mangroves, which are believed to be the second biggest in India.

Wildlife tours in Andhra Pradesh should also consist of a visit to Manjira Wildlife & Bird Sanctuary, Mrugavani National Park and the Alisagar Deer Park, which sit as few more wildlife gems of this beautiful Indian state.



HERITAGE

Andhra Pradesh, having been ruled by powerful and glorious dynasties like Mauryas, Cholas, Chalukyas, and the famous Vijayanagara Empire, is dotted with magnificent structures which reflect its rich past. For that very reason, it is regarded as one of the top tourist destinations to experience heritage tourism in India.

Your heritage tour should begin with a visit to the town of Amaravathi, located in Guntur district of Andhra Pradesh. It is a treasure house of several structures and monuments dating back to the Satvahana Era. The Amaravati Stupa, Amaravati Mahachaitya and Amaralingeswara Temple are some of the best heritage places to visit in Andhra Pradesh.

About 65 kilometers from Amaravati is another important heritage destination, Vijayawada. The second largest city in Andhra Pradesh, it is famous for the Kondapalli Fort, Undavalli & Mogalarajapuram Caves, Hazratbal Mosque and Mangalagiri – Lakshmi Narasimha Temple, among many others.

Heritage tourism in Andhra Pradesh is incomplete without visiting the beautiful village of Lepakshi which is located in Anantapur district, about 600 kilometers from Vijayawada. One of the most important heritage sites in the state, it highlights the legacy of Vijayanagara Empire and is famed for its group of shrines dedicated to Lord Vishnu, Shiva and Veerabhadra.

Apart from the splendid temple architecture and paintings, it is the hanging pillar supported from the ceiling that surprises the visitors.

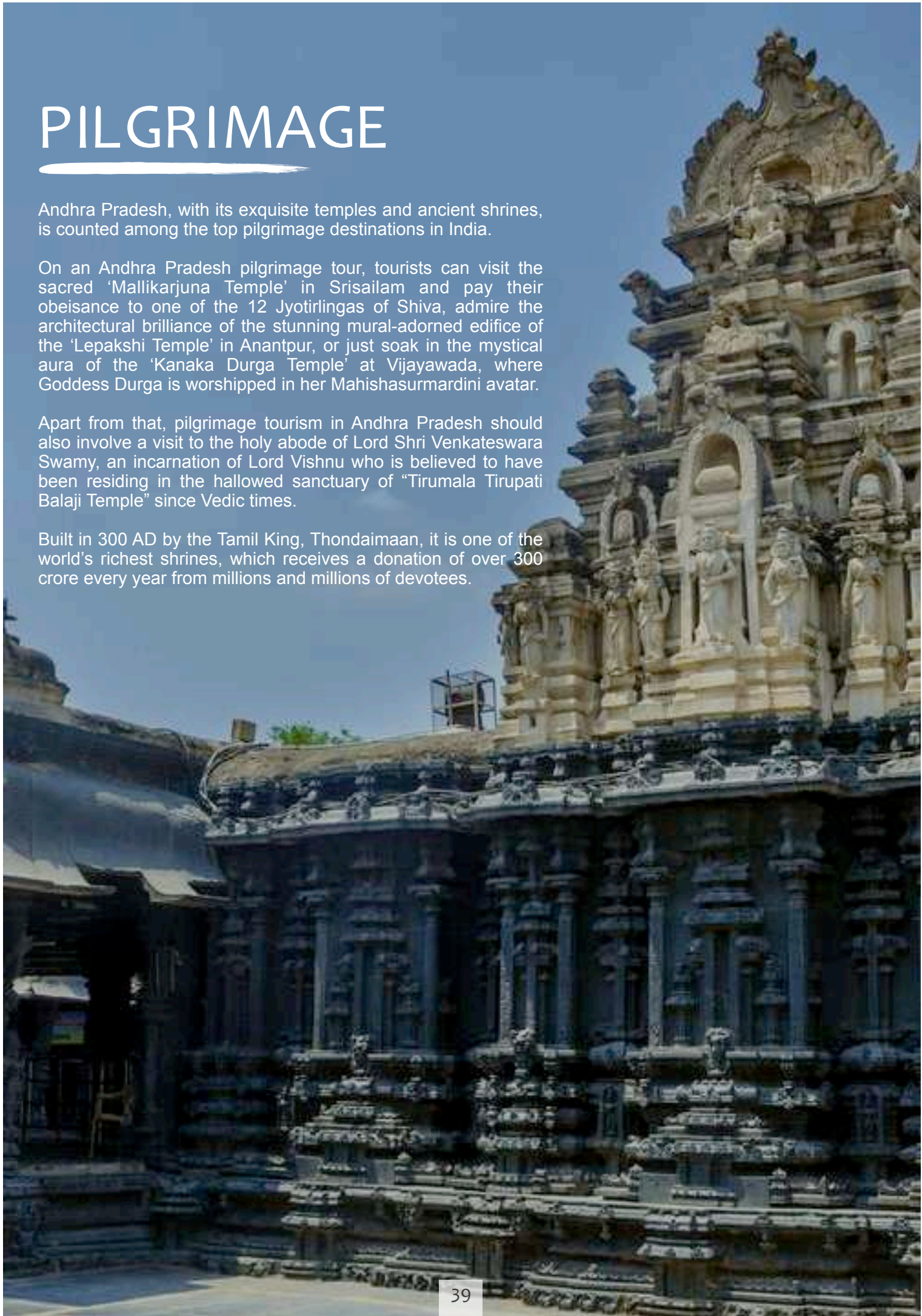
PILGRIMAGE

Andhra Pradesh, with its exquisite temples and ancient shrines, is counted among the top pilgrimage destinations in India.

On an Andhra Pradesh pilgrimage tour, tourists can visit the sacred 'Mallikarjuna Temple' in Srisailem and pay their obeisance to one of the 12 Jyotirlingas of Shiva, admire the architectural brilliance of the stunning mural-adorned edifice of the 'Lepakshi Temple' in Anantpur, or just soak in the mystical aura of the 'Kanaka Durga Temple' at Vijayawada, where Goddess Durga is worshipped in her Mahishasurmardini avatar.

Apart from that, pilgrimage tourism in Andhra Pradesh should also involve a visit to the holy abode of Lord Shri Venkateswara Swamy, an incarnation of Lord Vishnu who is believed to have been residing in the hallowed sanctuary of "Tirumala Tirupati Balaji Temple" since Vedic times.

Built in 300 AD by the Tamil King, Thondaimaan, it is one of the world's richest shrines, which receives a donation of over 300 crore every year from millions and millions of devotees.





ARTS & CRAFTS

Andhra Pradesh has gained tremendous prestige and importance in the past years for its brilliant contribution in the field of music, dance such as Dhimsa, Kolattam, Lambadi, Bhamu Kalapam Kuchipudi Dance, Butta Bommalu, Veeranatyam and drama like Burrakatha.

Three kinds of people live at Andhra Pradesh, and they all have contributed to the fields of Arts and Crafts in Andhra Pradesh to make it one of the principle states in India. They include the original inhabitants, hill dwellers and tribal people.

They have designed their own dances and in course of time these dances have won the hearts of millions across the world. Dance as an art form in Andhra Pradesh can also be classified as Social Dance, Religious Dance and Dance as a pastime.

Apart from its dance form, artifacts such as leather and wooden items or work of Andhra Pradesh have gained recognition across the globe.

HISTORY

Different fields of art comprise the Culture of Andhra Pradesh. The rich cultural heritage of Andhra Pradesh is evident from the internationally renowned Carnatic music.

The region is home to some of the most popular classical musicians like Thyagaraja and Annamacharya. The state's popular form of dance, Kuchipudi showcases immense talent and creativity. This dance form had originated in 300 BC and since then it has been a great contribution to Indian classical dance.

MONUMENTS



Andhra Pradesh, a state in South India shares its boundaries with Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, Orissa, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and the Bay of Bengal. It offers some of the country's most beautiful tourist locations. The Monuments of Andhra Pradesh are well known for their architecture and history.

Often called the Rice Bowl of India, Andhra Pradesh is blessed with a glorious past and an ancient historical era. Andhra Pradesh finds mention in the Mahabharata, Ramayana, Puranas and the Jataka Tales. Andhra Pradesh is divided into three major regions.

SHOPPING

Andhra Pradesh is a huge state having numerous attractions to boast of. While traveling to any foreign lands, people usually ask about the specialties of the particular place. For shopping lovers, the first question naturally comes out to be 'what to buy'. Giving an answer to their question, Andhra has loads and loads of items to set anyone on a shopping spree. This state is known world-wide for its exquisite pearl and diamond jewelry.

Apart from the alluring jewelry, the state also has a remarkable collection of handicrafts, old antiques, beautiful silk and cotton weaves. There are ample of jewelry showrooms in the state that brag of their glittering charms and delicate ornaments. Other items include amazing pearls of Hyderabad, astonishing silver filigree, clothes with 'banjara' mirror work, exotic perfumes (atar), 'bidri' work, Kondapalli toys, etc.

The main shopping places in Andhra Pradesh include Government Emporiums, Arts and Crafts Village, Basheerbagh, Abids, Nampally, Ameerpet, Himayatnagar, Begumpet, Somajiguda, Punjagutta Mahatma Gandhi Road, Begum Bazaar and Laad Market (Hyderabad).

TIRUPATI BALAJI

Tirupati, an ancient town at the southern end of Andhra Pradesh, is a pilgrim's paradise. The place is famous for its many Hindu shrines; the most revered being Sri Venkateswara Swamy or Tirupati Balaji temple.

Devotees from different parts of India and abroad visit this temple town, to seek the blessings of the Almighty. Other than religious centers, there are plenty of other places to visit in Tirupati for nature lovers, adventure seekers and historians. A visit to Tirupati is incomplete till you explore the other side of this divine town: calm, unspoiled and breathtakingly beautiful!

Sri Venkateswara Swamy Temple

A landmark Vaishnavite temple near Tirupati, Sri Venkateswara Swamy Temple is one of the most revered Hindu shrines and richest pilgrimage centers in the world. It is also the world's most-visited place of worship, receiving 50,000 to 100,000 devotees daily and up to 500,000 on special occasions.

Famed as Tirupati Balaji or Tirumala temple, this Dravidian-style shrine is dedicated to Lord Venkateswara. It is believed that Lord Venkateswara is an incarnation of Lord Vishnu who appeared on earth to save mankind from the trials of Kali Yuga.



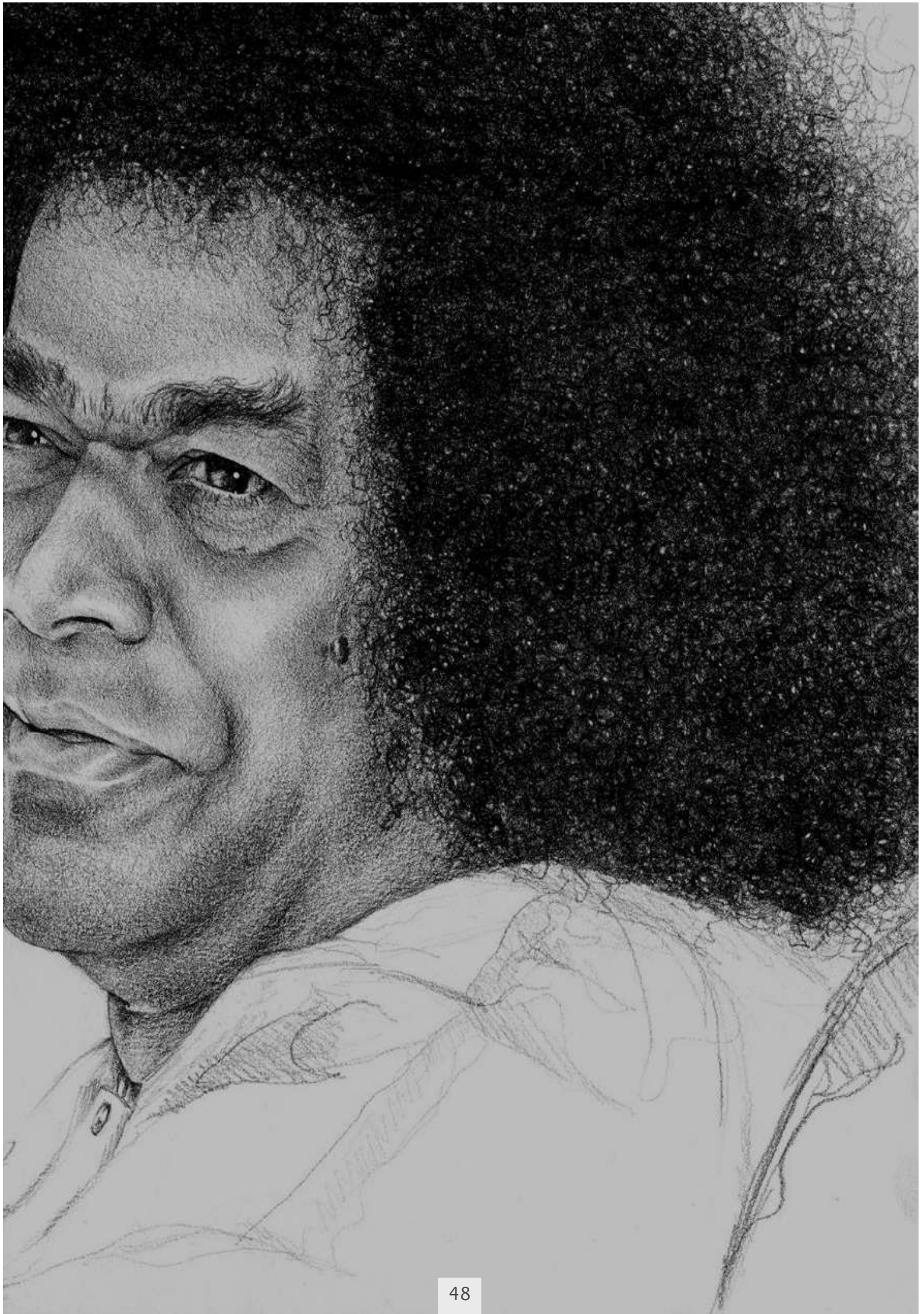
PUTTAPARTHI SAI BABA

A mortal with a life of ascetic but powers shrouded in mystery, Sai Baba of Shirdi is still a figure of reverence with a huge number of devotees. Shri Sathya Sai, (real name Sathyanarayana Raju) belonging to the holy town of Puttaparthi is believed to be reincarnation of Sai Baba by many of his followers. This makes the town holy and reverential for them.

Located in the Anantpur District of state of Andhra Pradesh, the town has Prasanthi Nilayam Ashram, attracting pilgrims and tourists alike. Being associated with the birth of Sri Sathya Sai, the place came in to highlight only after the various institution were established here for the well being of humanity, like specialty and charity hospitals, educational institutions, etc.

The story of the Sathya Sai Baba remains the main crowd puller which tells about a child, mother of whom told about miraculous conceiving of the baby. He then born with unusual intellect, realized fully when aged 14 and then proclaiming himself as the reincarnation of Sai Baba of Shirdi. After contributing in the ways and manners possible, Sathya Sai Baba died on 24 Apr' 2011, his Samadhi is located in Prasanthi Nilayam Ashrama.





MALLIKARJUNA TEMPLE



One of the 12 jyotirlingas, Mallikarjuna Jyotirlinga is in Mallikarjuna Swamy Temple and is dedicated to both Lord Shiva and his consort Goddess Parvati.

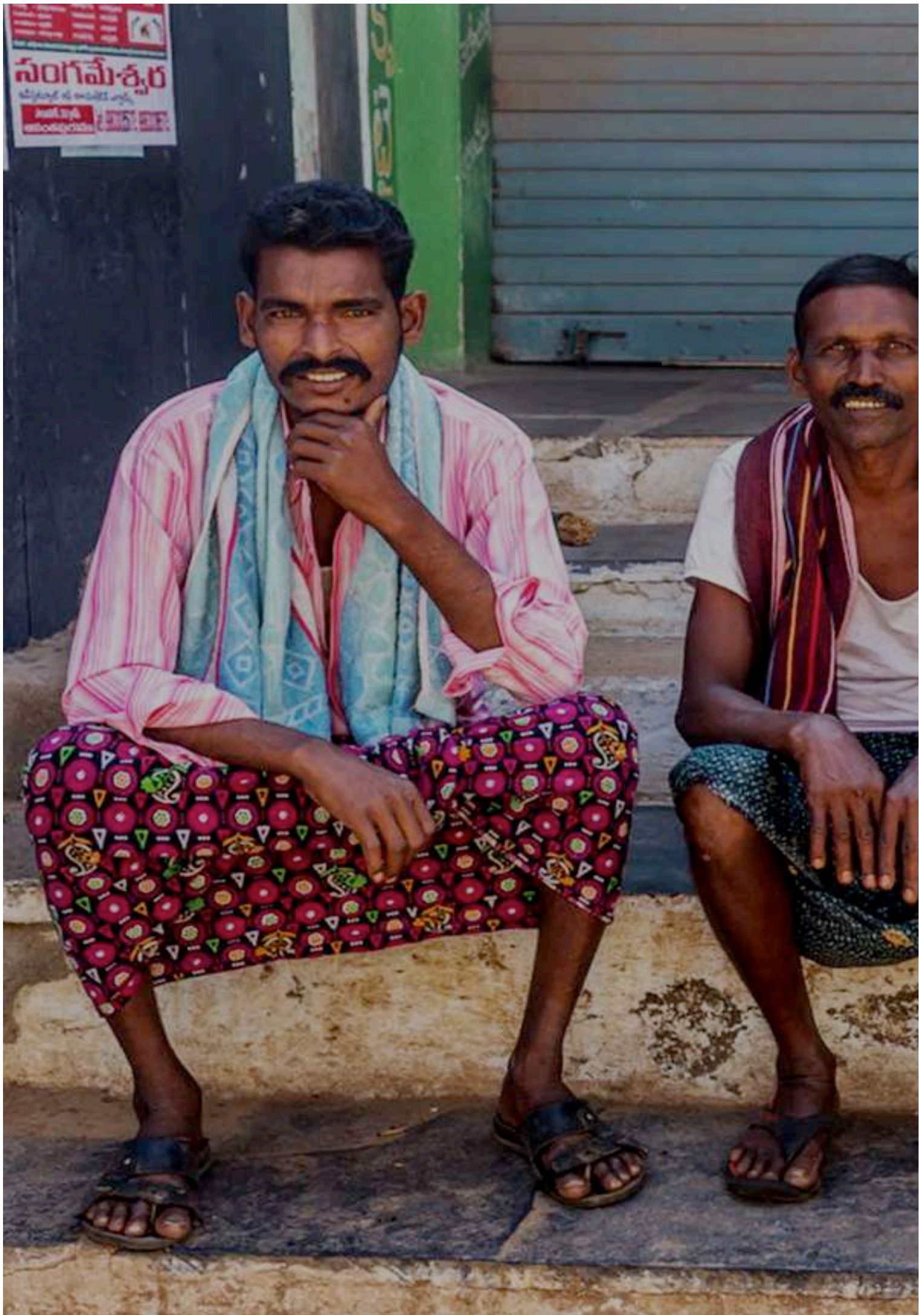
The second jyotirlinga is in Sri Bhramaramba Mallikarjuna Temple or Srisailem Temple in Andhra Pradesh. This temple is situated on a hilltop by the Krishna river.

Mallikarjuna Jyotirlinga is special in that it is both a jyotirlinga and a Shakti Peetha (special shrine to Shakti Devi - there are 18 of them) – there are only three such temples in India. It is believed that Lord Shiva appeared as Arjuna on Amavasya (No moon day) and Goddess Parvati as Mallika on Poornima (full moon day), and hence the name Mallikarjuna.

The temple is a work of architecture with its tall towers and beautiful carvings. It is also enclosed within tall walls that fortify it. Devotees believe that visiting this temple brings them wealth and fame. It is believed that Goddess Parvati fought the demon Mahishasura by transforming herself into a bee. Devotees believe they can still hear a bee buzzing through a hole in the Bhramaramba temple!

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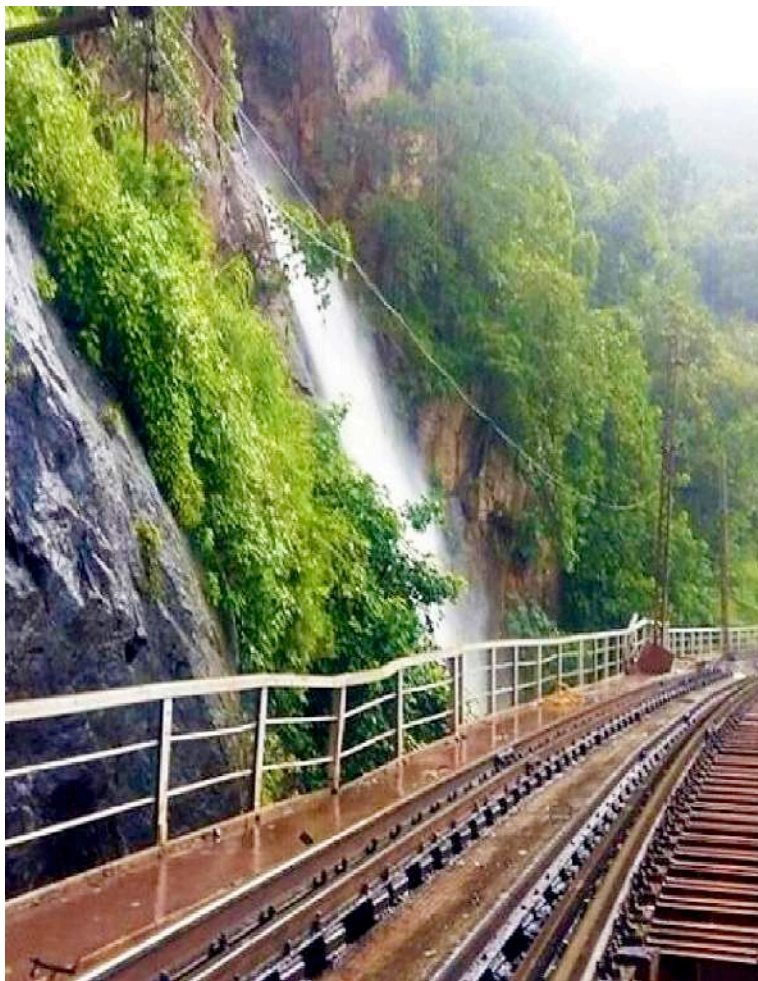
ACTIVITIES



Go On Vizag City Tour

The tour covers the ocean museum, war museum, submarines and other top attractions of Vizag. The tour will start from the Simhachalam temple which is dedicated to Lord Narasimha (An incarnation of Lord Vishnu) and will guide through the submarine museum which includes a weapon package which hauls from sea to land. Then we visit the Vishaka Museum, which is a house of historical artifacts from the Kalingandhra region.

After completing the tour to Visakha Museum, you visit Tenneti Park and then explore Ramakrishna beach. This is a long and lovely beach that stretches across the sea and sands and houses a Kali Temple and a Ramakrishna Ashram. Also, you can visit here the War Memorial which was built in the memory of soldiers during the 1971 war.



Visit Araku Valley

Araku Valley is also known as Andhra's Ooty and shelters various tribal communities. The valley is spread in an area of 36 sq. km and is blessed with the best of climate and lush green lands, with natural streams and waterfalls which makes this place a mecca for any nature lovers.

Araku Valley also has a tribal museum that showcases the lifestyle of the locals of this region and how it has evolved. After Araku Valley, the tour shall extend to Borra Caves, which are illuminated limestone caves at a height of 1400 meters above sea level. The caves are filled with fascinating stalagmites and stalactite formations.



Mayavi Caves

Mayavi Caves are technical caves located in Kurnool in Andhra Pradesh.

These beautiful caves are full of stalactites, stalagmites, flowstones and lots of shining minerals flowing through the caves. The caves are called technical caves because of few vertical sections present in the cave which require one to do rappelling for around 20 feet. The elevation of these caves is around 200 feet and involves around 1 km of hiking.

The entrance of the cave is small and might give you claustrophobic vibes. You need to climb down around 15 feet from the entrance to reach the first horizontal surface. Then two more obstacles require you to ascend and then descend using ropes. Once you reach on the other side of the first obstacle people often feel uneasy and breathless because the air there is almost stationary.

Trek To Talakona Waterfalls

This would be one of the most adventurous treks you would have had in recent times. The path is adorned with amazing flora and fauna. As you trek through the difficult terrain to the falls, the chirping birds and praying insects tend to keep your brain busy and you do not get the essence of tiredness.

The trek is in the Sri Venkateswara National Park in Chittoor district and fall is around 270 feet tall. The water falling from such a height leaves you speechless and gives you the worth of the trek to reach this location. The surroundings are covered in dense forests and lush green trees.

Other things to do around the fall are to watch the endangered species which live in this forest-like squirrels, panthers, sambar, cheetah, and porcupines. There is also a facility to experience 240 meters of canopy rope walk.



Experience The Freezing Point In Lambasingi

Yes, you heard it right. Andhra Pradesh where the nominal temperature is always around 40-degree centigrade, there is located a small village called Lambasingi and the temperature of this place never rises above 10-degree centigrade.

This is the only place in South India, where you may even experience snowfall during winters. Though it's not alike the snowfall you have in other hill stations, it's just dew getting frost and appears to be like snow hovering around freezing point.

This event is what made this place so famous. Though it is still not that much crowded when you reach this place, you will experience the winters in all its glory. The place is perched at a height of 1000 meters above sea level and coffee and tea plantations are one of the main jobs of the locals.



Hanging Pillar In Lepakshi Temple

Temple is dedicated to the Goddess Veerabhadra and is in a small village in Anantapur district in Andhra Pradesh. The temple was constructed during the reign of Vijayanagar Kings in the 16th century. The temple has a total of three shrines each dedicated to Lord Shiva, Vishnu, and Veerabhadra respectively. The unique thing about the architecture of this temple is its 70 pillars which support the temple. The main attraction of this temple is the largest sculpture of Veerabhadra and a hanging pillar called Aakasa Sthambha.

The pillar rather than resting on the ground is hanging from the ceiling and is always raised at a height of around one inch from the ground. People often like experimenting with this unique pillar by passing through their handkerchief through the base of this pillar. The whole temple stands on a rocky hill called 'Kurmasailam' or tortoise hill.



Wildlife Safari In Srisailam Wildlife Sanctuary

Srisailam wildlife sanctuary is India's one of the largest Tiger Reserves which is spread over five districts that are Nalgonda, Mahaboobnagar, Kurnool, Prakasam, and Guntur. The place was declared as a tiger reserve in the year 1983 and has river Krishna flowing through it over 130 km.

The terrain of this reserve is breathtaking and rugged and winds around the Mallamali hills. The dry deciduous forests with plenty of scrubs and bamboo thickets often provide shelter to the animals like tigers and leopard to sit and thrive for their food in a shape of deer, sloth bear, etc.

The place is also a house for multiple varieties of flora and fauna. There are around 20 rare species that are found only at this place. The fauna includes animals like tigers, leopard's sloth bears, etc.

Admire The Serene Beaches

Andhra Pradesh is a land of serene beaches and the best way to spend a day in summers in Andhra Pradesh is to go explore one of them.

Some of the best beaches that must not miss visiting in Andhra Pradesh are Baruva Beach in Srikakulam, Bheemunipatnam or Bheemili and Yarada Beach near Vizag.

Also, you must visit Suryalanka beach in Guntur, Vodarevu beach in Chirala and Ramakrishna beach in Vizag. You can visit any depending on your location at that time.

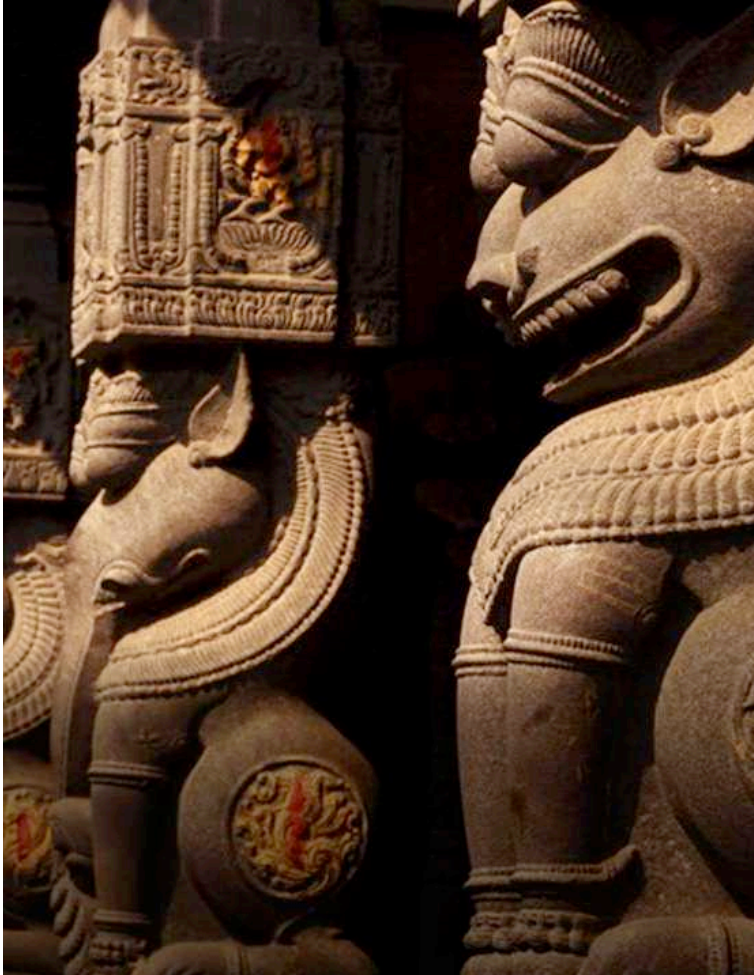
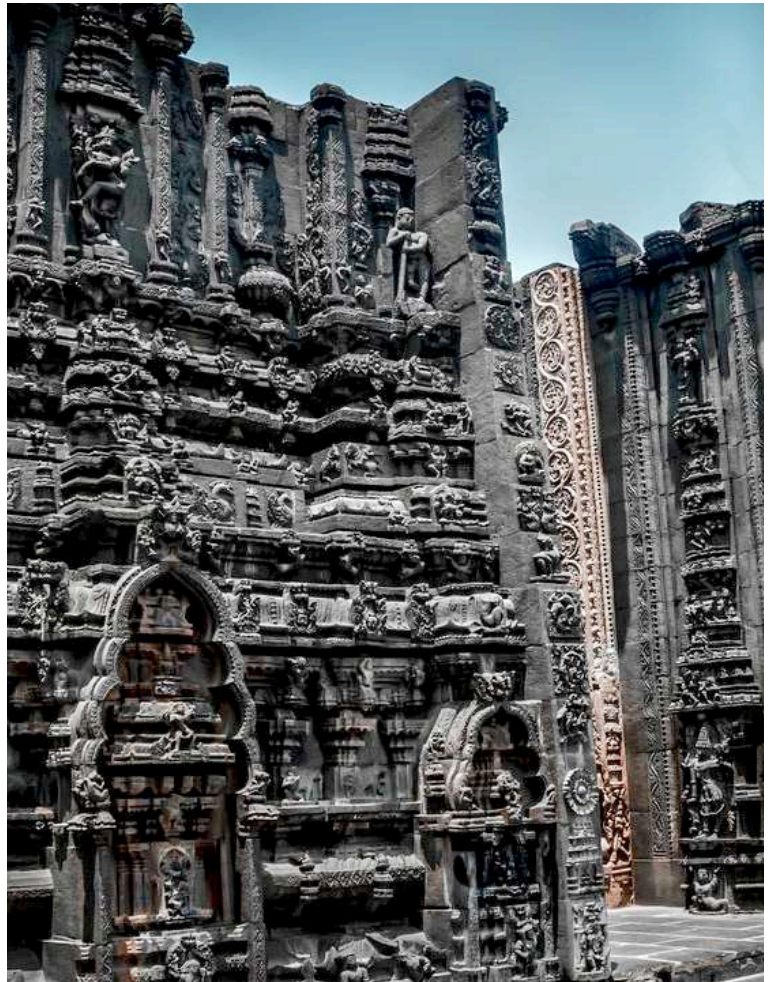


Bugga Ramalingeswara Swamy Temple

Located on the banks of the Penna River, about a kilometer away, has an equally impressive abundance of sculptures.

The gopurams to the north and south of the temple, although incomplete are regarded as one of the finest architectural legacies of the Vijayanagara Empire because of the precision and finesse with which sculptures have been etched on them.

Legend has it that the temples were built by two brothers in a single day. However, while the former was completed in the short span, Bugga Ramalingeswara Swamy Temple was only half-built. Photography and videography are allowed in both of the temples, though not inside the sanctum.

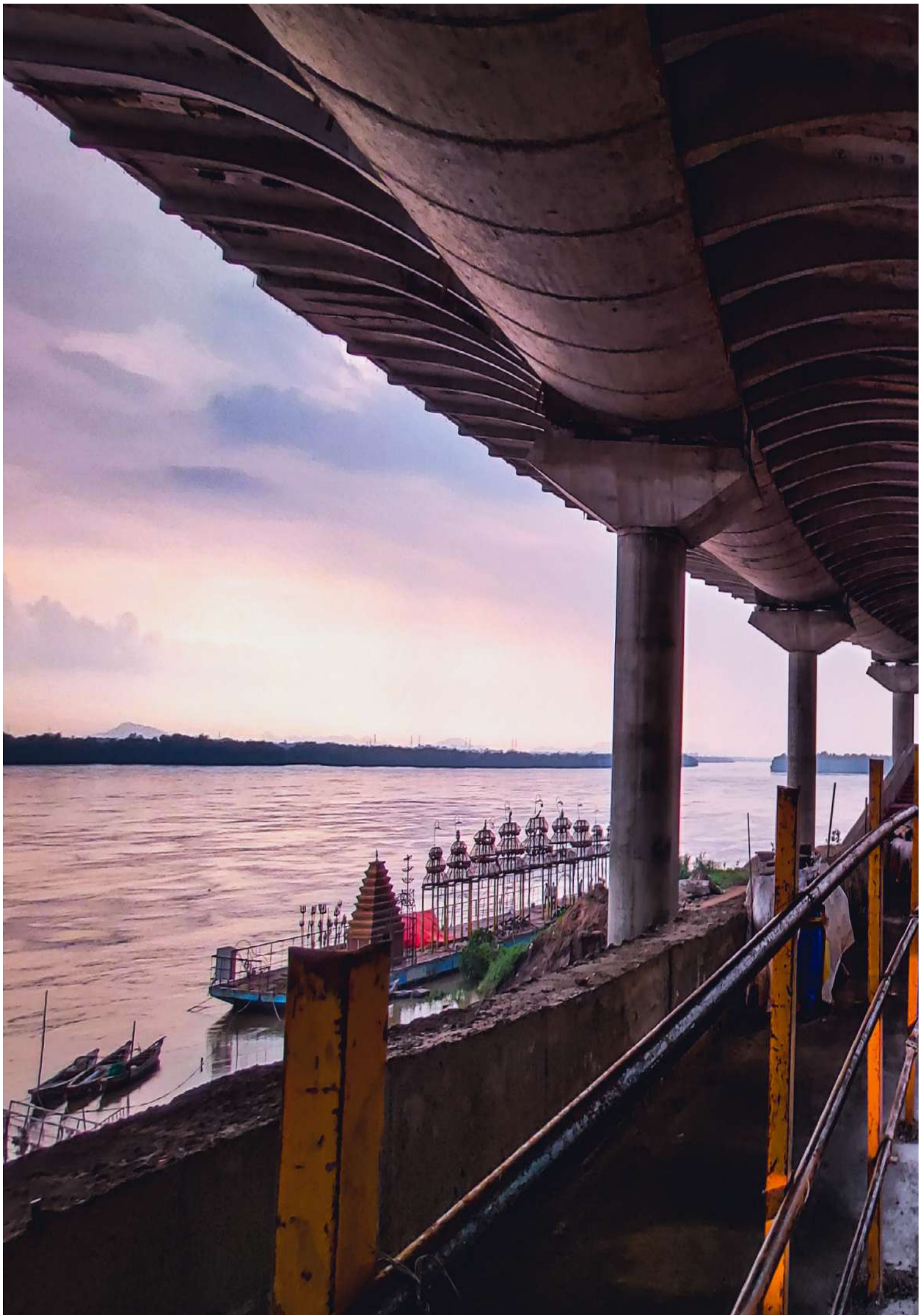


Simhachalam

About 16km from the city centre lies a small, densely wooded hill known as Simhachalam. The top of this hill is home to the temple of Varaha Laxmi Narasimha Swamy (the temple's main deity), built in the Kalinga style of architecture.

Other inscriptions suggest the temple belongs to the period of the Eastern Ganga Dynasty (somewhere between 1137-1306 CE). The statue of the presiding deity in the inner sanctum of the temple is covered with a layer of sandalwood paste for most of the year (the paste is removed from the statue only for 12 hours in a year, before Akshaya Tritiya). This temple is one of the 18 Narasimha kshetras in the country. It houses a beautifully carved 96-pillared kalyana mantapa and a natya mandapa amongst other structures.

Legend has it that the temple was constructed on the exact spot where Vishnu stood to protect Prahalada, as he killed the demon king and Prahalada's father Hiranyakashyapu, in the Narasimha (half-lion, half-man) avatar.





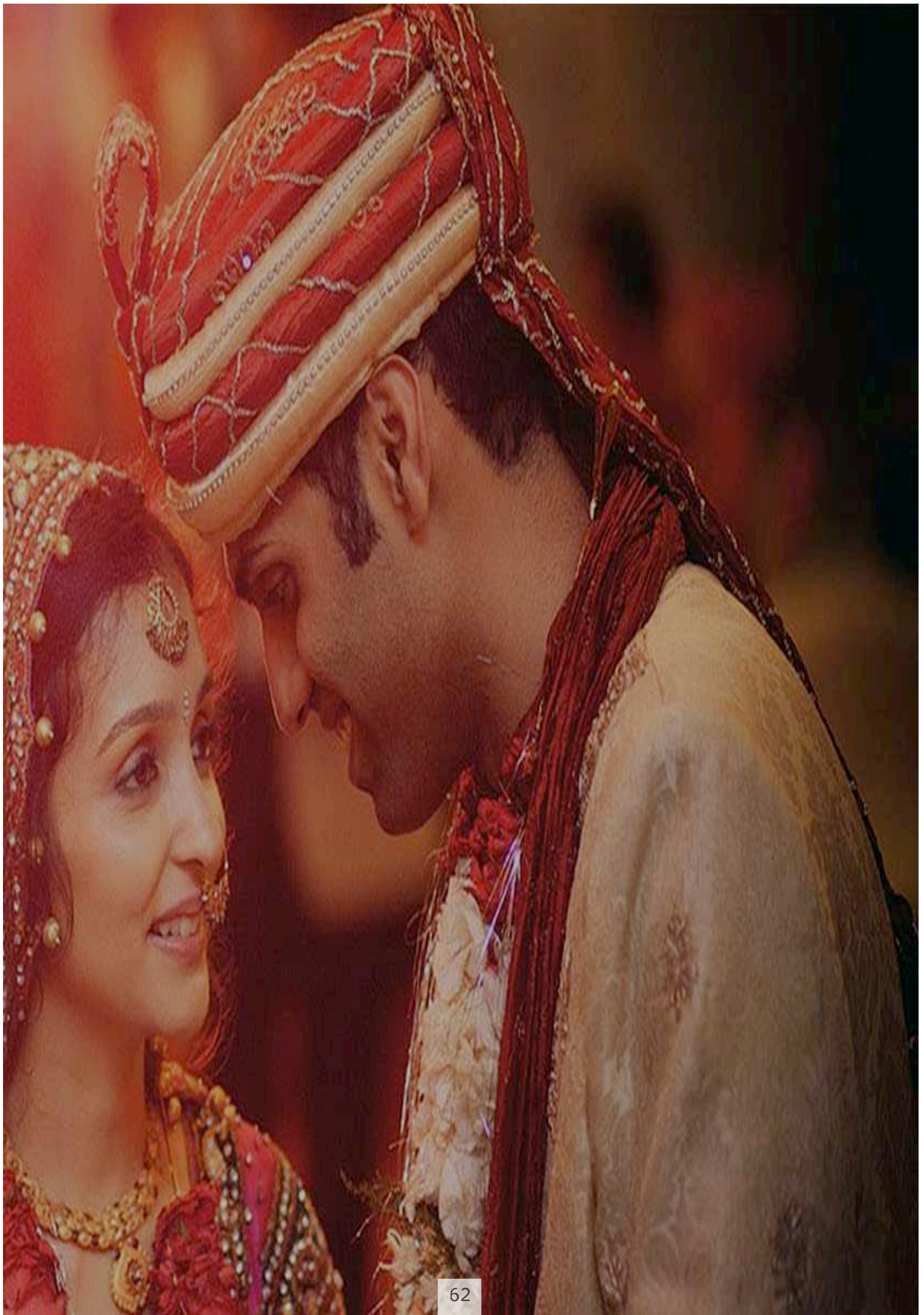
WEDDING

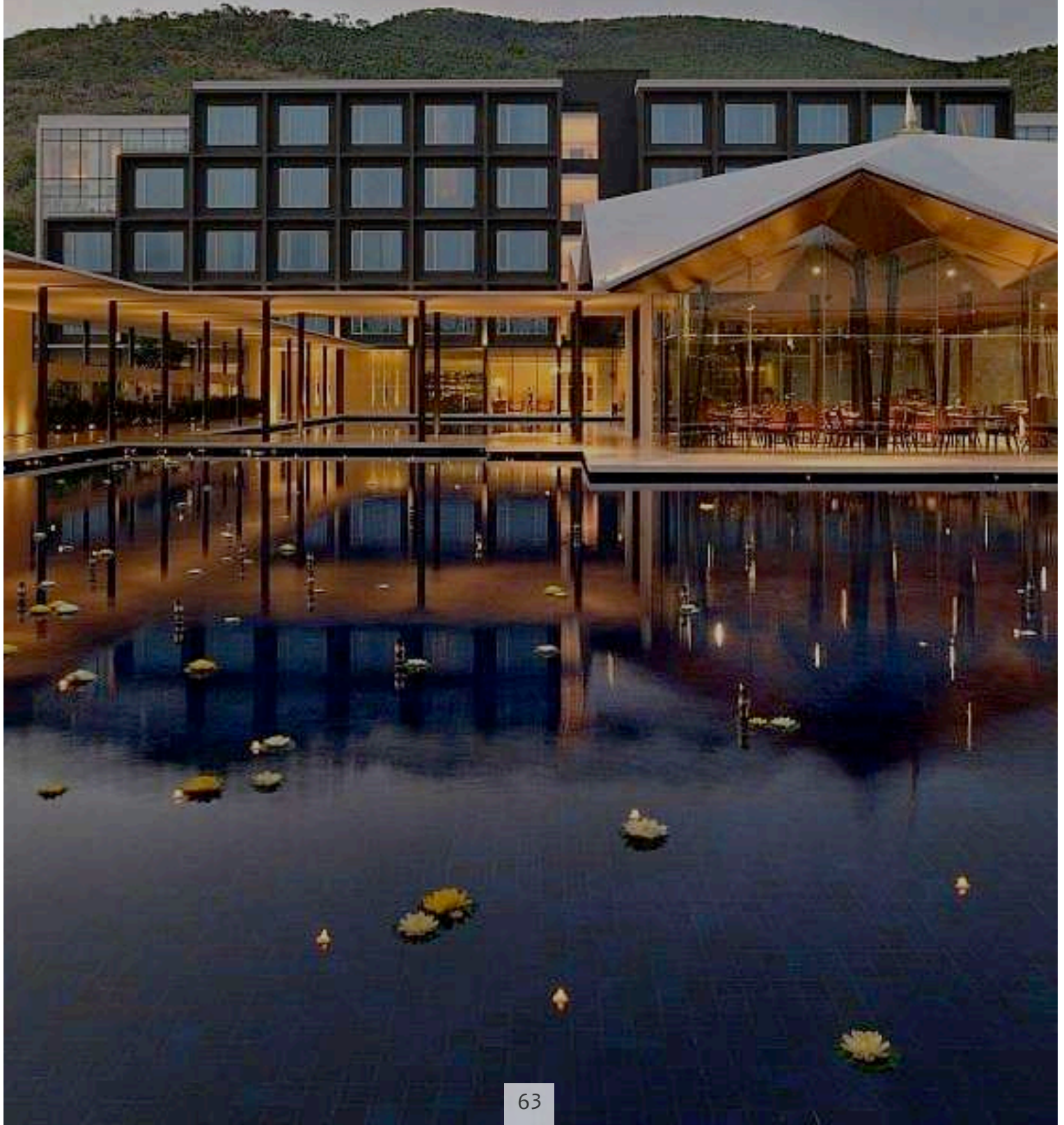
Generally, the weddings in Andhra Pradesh are conducted through Telugu wedding rituals. However, some people in this state also follow Tamil wedding rituals.
