

JUST THE FACTS

Getting Around

Resurrected atop of a mountain or "jabal" with various district and neighbourhoods that can help you navigate the chaotic streets; Amman is a bustling amalgamation of the old and the new. With high rise buildings erecting from the newly constructed Abdali complex to quaint shisha spots in the downtown al-ballad area; you're only a 2JD taxi ride away from whatever suits your mood.

Though Amman has many well known streets most addresses are rarely used and mail is typically delivered to neighbourhood post offices. Because of this people will typically us nearby landmarks to describe locations. Don't worry, this if far more efficient than it sounds, so don't be afraid to ask a local.

Accessibility

Visitors with a valid passport may obtain a visa at any Jordanian embassy or consulate abroad. A visa can also be obtained at Amman's Queen Alia International Airport (for unrestricted nationalities) or at any other border crossing except King Hussein Bridge and the ferryboat from Egypt. Visas are valid for one month, but can be extended at any

Water

Water is a precious resource in Jordan and visitors are encouraged not to waste it. Hotels rated 3 stars and up have their own water filtering systems and their water is considered safe to drink. Elsewhere, bottled water is inexpensive and readily available.

Values & Tradition

Jordan can be regarded as a typically Arab country for its people are very warm, friendly and hospitable. Jordanians are typically happy to forgive foreigners who break the rules of etiquette. However, visitors seen to be making an effort to observe local customs will undoubtedly win favour.

Joining local people for a cup of tea or coffee can be a wonderful way to learn more about local culture. If you are invited yet are unable to attend, then it is perfectly acceptable to decline. Place your right hand over your heart and politely make your excuses.


Attire

Jordan is a primarily Muslim country, although the freedom of all religions is protected. Muslim women's clothing often covers their arms, legs and hair.

Western women are not subject to these customs, but very revealing clothing is never appropriate and conservative dress is advisable for both men and women in the old part of Amman (downtown), and outside cities. Shorts are rarely worn by either sex, and would be out of place in the downtown Amman area.

Credit Cards

Credit cards are accepted at hotels, restaurants and larger shops, including American Express, Visa, Diners Club, and MasterCard. Please note that many smaller shops still prefer cash payment in the Jordanian currency, and it's essential for shopping in the local souks.





The calmness of the desert is sure calm your spirit and de-clutter your thoughts. Wadi Rum is waiting for you.




AMMAN

Amman, the capital of Jordan, is a fascinating city of contrasts – a unique blend of old and new, situated on a hilly area between the desert and the fertile Jordan Valley.

In the commercial heart of the city, ultra-modern buildings, hotels, smart restaurants, art galleries and boutiques rub shoulders comfortably with traditional coffee shops and tiny artisans' workshops.

Amman's neighborhoods are diverse and range in cultural and historical context from hustle and bustle of the downtown markets to the art galleries of Jabal Lweibdeh and the modern shopping district of Abdali.





UMM EL JIMAL

Rising out of Jordan's northern basalt plain, beautiful Umm al-Jimal is both a modern town and an ancient archaeological site, home to almost 2000 years of fascinating history and culture - Nabataean, Roman, Byzantine, Umayyad, Mamluk, Ottoman and Modern.

It was a thriving agricultural center and a stop on the Hijaz to Damascus caravan route.

One can explore over 150 well preserved ancient structures, built in neighborhoods along meandering alleys and around hosh-like plazas. Umm al-Jimal is also a modern community with much to offer to its visitors.

DEAD SEA

A spectacular natural wonder the Dead Sea is perfect for religious tourism and fun in the sun with the family. With its mix of beach living and religious history you can soak up the sun while Biblical scholars can get their daily dose of religious history.

The leading attraction at the Dead Sea is the warm, soothing, super salty water itself – some ten times saltier than sea water, and rich in chloride salts of magnesium, sodium, potassium, bromine and several others.

The unusually warm, incredibly buoyant and mineral-rich waters have attracted visitors since ancient times, including King Herod the Great and the beautiful Egyptian Queen, Cleopatra.



MADABA

Madaba is a combination of rural home life and a hot spot for religious tourism. Known as the "City of Mosaics" Madaba is the cultural epicenter for Byzantine and Umayyad mosaics.

Just a short distance from the capitol visitors are just a stone's throw away from the holy monuments of religious iconography.



JERASH

Jerash is an amazing blend of Greco-Roman and Oriental influences.

A great place to visit during the spring with its beautiful rolling hills and lush greenery, Jerash has a rhythm not seen anywhere else in Jordan.

Also, every year Jerash hosts the Jerash Festival of Culture and Arts, a three week summer program filled with folk dance, music, and theatrical performances.



AQABA

Situated on the southern tip of Jordan, approximately 4 hours from the capital of Amman, Aqaba is a beach town with Jordanian appeal.

Equipped with the local watering holes, to water sports, and a historical flair for those looking to revisit the past Aqaba is a delightful complement to the metropolitan appeal of Amman.



AJLUN

The marvels of nature and the genius of medieval Arab military architecture have given northern Jordan two of the most important ecological and historical attractions in the Middle East: the sprawling pine forests of the Ajlun-Dibbine area, and the towering Ayyubid castle at Ajlun, which helped to defeat the Crusaders eight centuries ago.

Locals often take advantage of the green landscapes of Ajlun to take a break from city life and connect with nature.





KERAK

Whether you approach Karak from the ancient Kings Highway to the east or from the Dead Sea to the west, the striking silhouette of this fortified town & castle will instantly make you understand why the fates of kings and nations were decided here for millennia.

An ancient Crusader stronghold, Karak sits 900m above sea level and lies inside the walls of the old city.

The city today is home to around 170,000 people and continues to boast a number of restored 19th century Ottoman buildings, restaurants, places to stay, and the like. But it is undoubtedly Karak Castle that dominates.

Zarqa is a Jordanian city and the capital of the Zarqa Governorate, which is nearly 20 km northeast of the capital city of Amman.

ZARQA

Zarqa is the third largest city in terms of population, with a population of about 572,290 in 2013, and is considered the industrial capital of Jordan.

There are many locations not to be missed in Zarqa including a wildlife reserve, a wetland reserve and several castles.



BIBILICAL CITIES

Home to several biblical cities including Sodom, Gomorrah, and Zoar, the archaeological discoveries between the Jordan River and Tal al-Kharrar have identified this area as Biblical "Bethany Beyond the Jordan." The area is where John was living when he baptized Jesus.

Designated as a UNESCO World Heritage site, the Baptism Site commission welcomes pilgrims from all around the world seeking spiritual connection to biblical times, a glimpse of history or a chance to be baptized where Jesus was so many years ago.

DESERT CASTLES

The beautiful examples of both early Islamic art and architecture, stand testament to a fascinating era in the country's rich history. Their fine mosaics, frescoes, stone and stucco carvings and illustrations, inspired by the best in Persian and Graeco-Roman traditions, tell countless stories of the life as it was during the 8th century. Called castles because of their imposing stature, the desert complexes actually served various purposes as caravan stations, agriculture and trade centres, resort pavilions and outposts that helped distant rulers forge ties with local Bedouins.

Several of these preserved compounds, all of which are clustered to the east and south of Amman, can be visited easily.



IRBID

Located in the north of Jordan with the second largest population in the kingdom, Irbid is a mix of authentic Arabian society with flashes of western influence. Boasting panoramic views of the West Bank and ancient architectures from the Roman era, Irbid tells a tale of its own.




AS-SALT

As-Salt is a thriving city situated North West of the capital Amman. Built on three main mountains (the cadital, gadaa and salalem), surrounded by the city square, As-Salt is enclosed by breathtaking views and is a wonderful contrast to some of the westernized sites of Amman.

Comfortably perched atop of mountains, As-Salt maintains an authentic society based on affection, brotherhood, and love.

The mountainside city also has significant historical relevance, most notably, as the regional capital of the Ottoman Empire.





WADI MUJIB

The Mujib Biosphere Reserve is the lowest nature reserve in the world, with a spectacular array of scenery near the east coast of the Dead Sea. The Reserve is located within the deep Wadi Mujib gorge, which enters the Dead Sea at 410m below sea level.

The Reserve extends to the Karak and Madaba mountains to the north and south, reaching 900 metres above sea level in some places. This 1,300m variation in elevation, combined with the valley's year- round water flow from seven tributaries, means that Wadi Mujib enjoys a magnificent bio-diversity that is still being explored and documented today.



DANA & FEYNAN

Dana Biosphere Reserve is an area of staggering beauty, history, and biodiversity.

The only reserve in Jordan that encompasses the four different bio-geographical zones of the country (Mediterranean, Irano-Turanian, Saharo-Arabian and Sudanian), it is a melting pot of species from Europe, Africa and Asia. Such a combination of natural communities in a single area is unique in Jordan and many of Dana Biosphere Reserve's animals and plants are very rare.


So far, a total of 800 plant species & 449 animal species have been recorded in the Reserve, of which 25 are known to be endangered, including the Sand Cat, the Syrian Wolf, the Lesser Kestrel and the Spiny Tailed Lizard.



UMM QAYS

Site of the famous miracle of the Gadarene swine, Gadara was renowned in its time as a cultural centre. It was the home of several classical poets and philosophers, including Theodorus, founder of a rhetorical school in Rome, and was once called "a new Athens" by a poet.

Perched on a splendid hilltop overlooking the Jordan Valley and the Sea of Galilee, Gadara is known today as Umm Qays, and boasts an impressive colonnaded street, a vaulted terrace, and the ruins of two theatres.

Day 01 - 02: Amman - The Capital

Upon arrival, you will be driven to the Northern part of Jordan to visit Jerash, one of the best Roman provincial cities in the Middle East region.

Continue to Jordan's capital, Amman, where old meets new and modern architecture sits side by side with ancient ruins. Visit the Roman Theatre and Citadel on a guided walking tour of Amman alongside your enthusiastic guide.

The next day, make a visit to Jordanian Desert Castles, including the UNESCO-listed Amra Castle, Qasr Kharanah and Azrag.

Day 03: Wadi Rum

Head four hours out to Wadi Rum, an amazing desert landscape with other-worldly scenery. After a jeep-ride with a local Bedouin, exploring all of the hidden sites of the desert, spend the night at a camp, where you can enjoy traditional Arabic cuisine and some epic stargazing.

Day 04 - 05: Petra

Set off to Al Beidha or Little Petra, once inhabited by the Nabataean with its many tombs. In the evening, enjoy the magic of Petra by Night as you stroll through the candle-lit pathways to the iconic Treasury (only available on Monday, Wednesday or Thursday).

The next morning, we dedicate the entire day to explore the legendary Petra. Petra really is astounding; a rose-red city hewn from the rock face, with awe-inspiring temples, tombs and caves.

Day 06 - 07: Dead Sea

You will then travel back up via the King's Highway to Kerak, the famous crusader castle of the 12th century.

Continue to the Dead Sea. This is the lowest point on earth, which has an extraordinary effect on the water. Nearly ten times saltier than the ocean, the Dead Sea's water is extremely buoyant, which allows visitors to practically float on the surface. The water and mud have an abundance of minerals, and the air is oxygen-rich, making this a fantastic place to relax and rejuvenate at the end of the trip.

During your stay in Dead Sea, you will also enjoy a day excursion to Madaba with its famous mosaic and to Mount Nebo where Moses once viewed the Holy Land.

Day 08: Depart Amman



Day 01 - 02: Amman - The Capital

Amman, the capital of Jordan, is a modern city with numerous ancient ruins. Atop Jabal al-Qala'a hill, the historic Citadel includes the pillars of the Roman Temple of Hercules and the 8th-century Umayyad Palace complex, known for its grand dome.

Built into a different downtown hillside, the Roman Theater is a 6,000-capacity, 2ndcentury stone amphitheater offering occasional events.

Day 03 - 04: Petra

Petra is a famous archaeological site in Jordan's southwestern desert. Dating to around 300 B.C., it was the capital of the Nabatean Kingdom.

Accessed via a narrow canyon called Al Siq, it contains tombs and temples carved into pink sandstone cliffs, earning its nickname, the "Rose City." Perhaps its most famous structure is 45m-high Al Khazneh, a temple with an ornate, Greek-style facade, and known as The Treasury.

Day 05 - 07: Wadi Rum

Wadi Rum is a protected desert wilderness in southern Jordan. It features dramatic sandstone mountains like the many-domed Jebel Um Ishrin, and natural arches such as Burdah Rock Bridge.

Many prehistoric inscriptions and carvings line rocky caverns and steep chasms, such as Khazali Canyon.

The natural watering hole of Lawrence's Spring is named after British soldier Lawrence of Arabia, who allegedly washed there.

Day 07 - 08: Dead Sea

The Dead Sea is a salt lake bordered by Jordan to the east and Israel and the West Bank to the west.

It lies in the Jordan Rift Valley, and its main tributary is the Jordan River. Its surface and shores are 430.5 metres below sea level, Earth's lowest elevation on land.

Day 09: Depart Amman

Day 01 - 02: Amman - The Capital

You will begin your trip with two nights in Amman, which gives you a chance to get to grips with this fascinating city. Embark on a walking tour of Amman with a private guide for the day in order to enjoy historical overview of the country and region, stretching back to the Roman age, through the Islamic and Umayyad period up until the present day.

Day 03 - 04: Dana Nature Reserve

From Amman you will continue by road to the Dana Nature Reserve, where you will trek to your next hotel. Start at the top of valley and wind your way down through the spectacular scenery, accompanied by your local Bedouin guide, before arriving at the wonderful Feynan Ecolodge.

Day 05 - 06: Petra

Your next destination is the legendary Petra, just over an hour's drive away. Entering through the Siq, your first glimpse of the Treasury is hugely memorable. Journey through the desert on a 4x4 jeep ride with a local Bedouin, stopping off to admire the natural wonders and hidden historical sites. The Red Sea is one of the best places in the world for diving and snorkelling, just an hour's drive from Wadi Rum. We have included a half day snorkelling trip, but of course diving is also available. If you would prefer to just relax, the inviting pools and private beaches in the area are the perfect spots to do this.

Day 10 - 12: Dead Sea

It takes three hours to drive from the Red Sea to the Dead Sea where you will finish your trip. Floating on the salty water of the Dead Sea is an extraordinary experience, and there are some fabulous spa treatments on offer here. Should you wish, it is also possible to continue your cultural exploration, with visits to the historical town of Madaba and the holy sites of Mt Nebo and Bethany Beyond the Jordan.



From Petra it is only an hour and a half drive to Wadi Rum, an area made famous by Lawrence of Arabia. Spend a night at a luxurious camp in the desert, where you can enjoy traditional Bedouin cuisine whilst gazing up at a sky thick with stars.

Day 06: Dead Sea

Your final night in Jordan will be spent by the Dead Sea, just a 3.5-hour drive from the desert. Floating on the salty water is an experience not to be missed, and the mud from the banks, available for full-body masks, is believed to have healing properties.



Day 01 - 03: Amman - The Capital

Your journey begins in Amman, the capital of Jordan. Amman is an excellent base to do trips to Jerash, which boast incredible Roman ruins that are well worth exploring. The Ajloun Forest Reserve also offers some wonderful treks for those who want to dive straight into the adventure. We also recommend a walking tour of the downtown area with your friendly guide, who will be able to point out key locations such as the Roman Theatre and the Citadel.

Day 04 - 06: Dana Nature Reserve

Journey on to the Dana Nature Reserve via the King's Highway, where you can stop off to visit historical sites en route. The crusader castle at Kerak, built in 1142, resisted countless attacks, and was said to light a beacon every night to let Jerusalem know that it had not fallen. Other highlights on the King's Highway include the Mosaic town of Madaba and Mt Nebo, where it is believed Moses was shown the Promised Land. Spend the night deep in the heart of this beautiful scenery.

Day 07 - 08: Petra

The drive from Feynan to Petra winds through stunning scenery. Petra does not disappoint, whether you enter the site by the narrow Siq or trek in through the back route, accompanied by a local guide. You will be staying at the charming Hyatt Zaman. Whilst this is a 15-minute drive from the entrance to Petra, it is one of the most characterful properties in the country and offers panoramic views.

Day 09: Wadi Rum

Wadi Rum is a stirking mix of sandstone mountains, dunes and red and gold sand. Enjoy spending the day with a local Bedouin, trekking in the desert and learning about local culture and customs before continuing on to your camp. Take in the incredible sunset and

sample delicious traditional Arabic cuisine for dinner before another night of amazing stargazing.

Day 10 - 11: Dead Sea

Your final stop just over 3.5 hours' drive away will be the Dead Sea for some rest and relaxation.

The spa treatments are not to be missed, and the sensation of swimming (or rather floating) in the Dead Sea is something not easily forgotten. Spend two nights here unwinding and relaxing after your adventure, until it is time to return home.







Frequently Asked Questions

How do I get to Jordan?

By air: There are two international airports in Jordan: Queen Alia International Airport in Amman and King Hussein International Airport in Aqaba. If you are traveling from outside the Middle East, Amman is your best bet.

By land: If you are coming from neighboring Israel or the Palestinian Territories, you have three border crossing options for arriving in Jordan: King Hussein Bridge in the north, the Allenby Bridge near the Dead Sea, or Wadi Araba on the Red Sea. Be sure to double check visa requirements, exit taxes, and hours of operation, as these are subject to change.

How big is Jordan?

At 34,495 mi², Jordan is a relatively small country — slightly smaller than the U.S. state of Indiana. From Um Qais in the north to Aqaba in the south, the entire length of Jordan is just over 400 miles.

The Dead Sea resorts (to the south of Amman) and the Roman ruins of Jerash (to the north) are both less than an hour from the capital city, and the top tourist destinations of Petra and Wadi Rum can be reached by car in about 3-4 hours from Amman.

Visitors generally travel by car, although domestic flights between Aqaba and Amman are an option.

Can I bring my children?

Absolutely! Jordanians tend to be very family-oriented, so children are welcome in most places.

Are credit cards widely accepted?

In the main cities and most hotels throughout the country, credit cards are generally accepted. However, you are likely to find that Bedouin camps, smaller shops, and restaurants are cash only. It is recommended that you keep cash on you, so you don't find yourself out in the desert, far from an ATM!

Do women have to wear hijab?

No, hijab are not required in Jordan — unless entering a mosque, which you are not likely to be allowed to do unless you are Muslim.

While you will see many women wearing hijab in Jordan, there are also plenty of women who do not wear them.

That being said, you will notice that for the most part (outside of the international bars and restaurants), women dress conservatively, with chest, shoulders, and legs covered.

What is the food like?

Food and family are hugely important to Jordanian culture, so you are likely to find yourself eating often and in a variety of settings — from standing at a street stall in downtown Amman or dining on international cuisine at a rooftop restaurant, to eating around a campfire in Wadi Rum or sitting on the floor of a family home.

The food is influenced by both Bedouin culture and international flavors, so you'll discover a variety of dishes to choose from, most containing meat, vegetables, herbs, and rice or bread.

The national dish, mansaf — made of lamb, yoghurt, and rice — is a must. You'll find falafel and hummus aplenty, and olive oil used in many dishes. Mediterranean and Middle Eastern herbs are also commonly used.

Be sure to sample some of the herb blend za'atar sprinkled on labneh cheese, bread, yoghurt, or used as a rub on meat. The ingredients vary, but most za'atar contains thyme and oregano, and in Jordan, it often includes wild sumac.

Is there a tipping culture in Jordan?

Yes. A 10% tip is standard. In restaurants, a 10% service charge is often added (check your bill), but as service industry wages are often low and the restaurant — not the worker — may be receiving that service charge, a bit extra is always appreciated.

In a taxi, you can round up to the closest dinar and give them a few extra dinars if they help with heavy bags. For porters, 1-2 dinars per bag is expected. Leave the housekeeping staff at least 2 JD per night and the room service 2-5 JD.

If you treat yourself to a spa experience, be sure to tip there as well: 5-10 JD, depending on service and treatment.

What should I pack?

This depends largely on the season and the activities you'll be doing. As Jordan has a desert climate, expect high temperatures and a lot of sunshine in the summer; comfortable temps and some rain in the spring and fall; cold weather, shorter days, and much more rain (and occasionally snow) in the winter.

The best way to prepare is to bring breathable layers (natural fabrics are recommended) that can be added and removed throughout the day with the changing conditions. If you will be hiking, be sure to pack appropriate footwear. And of course, you'll need sunscreen and a hat.

If you'll be spending time in Amman, don't forget to bring along clothing that you'd wear in a city. Many locals in Amman are well-dressed and some restaurants enforce a dress code, so you will certainly be out of place (and maybe not allowed in) if you try to attend a nice rooftop dinner in your hiking gear.

Are vaccinations required?

Immunisations are not required to visit these countries. Depending on the season and region of travel, certain vaccinations and medications are suggested and we will recommend preventative measures.

Are trips physically demanding?

Want to lie in a hammock and not move until cocktail hour? We've got a trip for that. Want to power up the side of mountain at high altitude? We've also got a trip for that. To determine what type of trip suits you best, each of our trips comes with a Physical Rating to let you know how physically demanding it is... or isn't.

Does SGV have family trips?

SGV offers a wide range of Family Adventures around the globe. The minimum age (for Family trips) varies depending on destination, and SGV has set minimum ages to ensure that the included activities suit each age range.

Additionally, you'll notice that some of the more adventurous destinations have a higher minimum age.

Are there age restrictions on your trips?

For the majority of our trips the minimum age is 15. An adult must accompany all children under the age of 18. We have a minimum age of 18. Younger children can join us on our Family trips and Short Break Adventures. Most of our trips don't have a maximum age limit, but a Self- Assessment Form is required for all passengers 70 years and over.

Can I travel alone if I don't speak Arabic?

Yes and no. Many people in Jordan speak at least a little English, but it may be very limited. If you are in Amman and tourist areas such as Petra, you will likely be ok. If you are traveling off the beaten path, you'll want to book a local guide. Beyond simply assisting with communication, a local guide can offer valuable knowledge of culture, history, food, and customs that you may not otherwise learn on your own.

BAGGAGE REGULATIONS AND SOME RECOMMENDATIONS

- · Make sure you check the baggage allowance on your international / internal flights.
- · We recommend to travel light especially when there is internal flight involved in the program due to baggage weight limitation.
- · We suggest that you carry one set of clothes along with your daily utility items and other accessories in your hand baggage. This is just a precautionary measure in case your baggage is misplaced.

- · Please note that airlines do not permit items like loose batteries, razor blades, nail cutter, scissors, knives, gels any form of liquid, cigarette lighter in your hand baggage. If required carry such items in your check –in bag.
- · Please ensure that you do not place any valuables in your check in bag. Carry foreign currency / travel documents / jewellery / insurance in your hand bag.

COACH

- · Since travelling distances are comparatively long, we have carefully chosen air conditioned luxurious coaches for your convenience luxurious coaches for your convenience and comfort. It is very important to maintain a pleasant environment on board the coach and keep it clean.
- · Drinking, Smoking and eating is not allowed in the coach.

MEALS

· You have a choice of local and international cuisine meals. The menus, however are fixed in advance and a la carte is also possible upon request.

- · Most lunches and dinner are unlimited buffets, but it is requested that you do not waste food.
- · If there is any early morning departure to the airport a box breakfast may be provided.
- · Some cities you may be served local meals.

CLIMATE

- The climate is as varied as its countries, but it is mostly temperate.
- · Frequent changes of weather make forecasting difficult. To be on the safe side, be sure to bring a sweater and an umbrella with you.

HOTELS & ROOMS

- · Most hotels offer the facility of complimentary safe deposit lockers (few hotels charge a refundable deposit. we advice that you keep all your valuable like money, passport, tickets and jewellery in the locker, in case you are staying for more than one day at the hotel.
- · Please make sure that no damages are done to your hotel room during the stay, as the same would be charged to you directly by the hotel.
- · Hotel rooms may have facilities like mini bar, pay television channels, telephones, etc. please note that these facilities are not complimentary and will be charged as per actual usage.
- · Most of the hotels do not have a tea/ coffee kettle in the rooms.
- · Please note that we will try our best to provide you with adjacent rooms asked by you at the time of booking, but the same will be subject to availability at the time of check –in. It is also difficult to provide interconnecting rooms, however the tour manager and the hotel will try their best to ensure that you are provided with adjacent rooms wherever possible.
- The standard check in time at hotels is after 14:00 HRS and standard check –out time is 10:00 HRS.

TIME MANAGEMENT

- · It's very important to be on time and punctual on your holiday, since your itinerary has been designed and planned to offer you the most on your holiday.
- · Every sightseeing trip where you get off has an allotted time, please make sure you remain with the group return at the allotted time. Any delay would actually deprive the entire group of their sightseeing time.

ON ARRIVAL

- · ALL passengers will be met by our tour manager / local representative outside the arrival hall at the airport.
- · All joining direct passengers will have to reach the respective hotel/ airport, on their own and check in.

CLOTHING

- · Warm clothing like sweaters , jackets, woolen, thermals is essential. You must carry a cap, sunglasses, a folding umbrella, comfortable footwear preferably walking shoes.

- · Carry a photocopy of your passport including valid visas & keep them separately from the original.

- · Carry your mobile phone's charger if you are taking your cell phone with global roaming. Also carry multipurpose adapter as sockets are different.
- · Required medicines, with doctor's prescription.

MONEY AND CURRENCY


· EURO and USD are widely accepted and can be exchanged to any major currency exchange counter. it is better to carry USD before you start your trip.


TIPPING POLICY
