





The mosque houses three libraries, separate prayer and ablution halls for men and women, and special halls for Quran memorisation, and can hold over 30,000 worshippers.



DAHL AL MISFIR

Located west of Doha, in the centre of the peninsula, Dahl Al Misfir is one of Qatar's most exciting natural sites.

At 40 meters deep, it is considered the largest and deepest, yet accessible cave in Qatar.

Formed largely of fibrous gypsum, it sometimes gives off a faint, otherworldly glow.





AL SHAQAB

Al Shaqab, a Qatar Foundation member since 2004, is Qatar's state-of-the-art equestrian centre, dating back to 1992. It aims to preserve the historical traditions and legacy of the Arabian horses; animals that are highly respected in the country.

Home to more than 700 of them, Al Shaqab introduces one of the world's leading and most advanced equestrian programmes based on three main principles - excellence, education and heritage.

THE PEARL QATAR

The Pearl, Qatar is a man-made island offshore Doha's prestigious West Bay District, featuring Mediterranean-style yacht-lined marinas, residential towers, villas, and hotels, as well as introducing a luxurious shopping experience with premium designer boutiques and showrooms. QATAR NATIONAL LIBRARY


Located in the heart of Education City, this stateof-the-art building provides access not only to to millions of books, but all sorts of cutting edge learning facilities, programs and equipment for public use.


THE BRIDGE QANAT QUARTIER



It's home to numerous beaches, coral reefs and nature reserves, as well as rare animals such as giant Aldabra tortoises. Mahé, a hub for visiting the other islands, is home to capital Victoria. It also has the mountain rainforests of Morne Seychellois National Park and beaches, including Beau Vallon and Anse Takamaka.



A visit to Mutrah Souq is a must if you want to experience the culture of Oman first-hand. This traditional, chaotic Arab market has numerous shops selling Omani artefacts, jewellery, and textile.



AL BURAIMI

Located in the north-west of Oman and bordering A'Dhahirah, Al Buraimi is a semi-desert plain which descends from the southern slopes of the western Al Hajar Mountains. Ruins in the area, such as those found at the villages of Sharm and Madhbah, highlight the existence of ancient trade routes.

From the 'Fossil Valley' of Jebel Huwayah to the many castles within the interior villages and countryside and the golden sands of the Rub Al Khali (the Empty Quarter), Al Buraimi offers plenty of opportunities for those with a taste of adventure. The town of Al Buraimi also serves as the traditional border to Al Ain (UAE), about 370km from Muscat.



AL BATINAH NORTH

Al Batinah North governorate is an expansive coastal area that hosts a fertile agricultural plain that extends along the coast and extends over its lands agricultural fields and population centers. In this governorate are distributed many castles, forts, fences and ancient villages, the most famous of which is Sohar Fort and the forts in Shinas, Liwa, Saham, Al Khabourah and As Suwayq. Al Batinah North Governorate has a very vital geographical location extending along the southern coast of the Sea of Oman.

Sohar, Oman's capital city in ancient times, is located in this region and rumoured to be the hometown of the legendary Sindbad the Sailor.

AL BATINAH SOUTH

South Al Batinah Governorate extends between the Sea of Oman in the east and the foothills of the Western Hajar Mountains in the west, and by virtue of its location, economic potential and population density, it has played an influential role throughout Omani history.

Dotted with historic sights and breath-taking scenery, South Al Batinah is considered the green belt of Oman with most of the country's fresh produce harvested on plantations in the area.





A'DHAHIRAH

Once situated in prime position on the ancient trade routes, A'Dhahirah in Oman's west is traditionally the bridge between Oman's stunning mountain ranges and the neighbouring UAE and Saudi Arabia.

Archaeology and history play a major role in this region, which extends all the way from the Al Hajar Mountains to the Empty Quarter known as Rub Al Khali. The city of Ibri can be reached within a few hours from Muscat, and is home to the impressive Ibri Fort, with its ancient mosque and many different gates. The small village of Bat, east of Ibri, is home to a remarkable array of beehive tombs from the Bronze Age, listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1988.

AL WUSTA

Flanked on the east by the Arabian Sea, on the west by the Rub Al Khali – The Empty Quarter – and by Oman's most southern governorate – Dhofar – to the south, Al Wusta covers a large area in the middle of the Sultanate.

The governorate possesses a long curving coasting and is home to vast sandy beaches stretching for miles. Settlements in this region are generally smaller but this region is a haven for wildlife and nature lovers. Bird watching enthusiasts can spot over 130 different species, including migratory birds from as far away as Europe. The Barr Al Hikman peninsula is especially known for visiting flocks of flamingos.



A'DAKHILIYAH

A'Dakhiliyah, meaning 'The Interior', is a land-locked governorate comprised of a portion of the Al Hajar Mountain range and eight separate districts: Adam, Al Hamra, Bahla, Bidbid, Izki, Manah, Nizwa and Samail.

The Sultanate's highest mountain – Jebel Shams – and Jebel Al Akhdar, The Al Hoota Caves, a recently-restored vast cave system estimated to be over two million years old and rich with stalactites and stalagmites, and many ancient castles and forts which have also been beautifully restored and are now open to the public are also of interest, especially UNESCO World Heritage Sites the Bahla Fort and the renowned Nizwa Fort and Soug.



A'SHARQIYAH NORTH

Consisting of the governorates of North and South Ash Sharqiyah, this part of Oman is widely considered the geographical jewel of the Sultanate. It is here that stunning coastlines give way to the unique ecosystem that is Sharqiyah Sands, making this region a paradise for adventurers and explorers.

North A'Sharqiyah Governorate overlooks the internal side of the Hajar Mountains, to the north it is connected to Muscat Governorate, to the west is Al Dakhiliyah Governorate, and to the east and south is South A'Sharqiyah Governorate. It includes six districts: Ibra, Al-Mudaybi, Bidiyyah, Al Qabil, Wadi Bani Khalid and Dama Wa Al-Taeyeen.



A'SHARQIYAH SOUTH

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MUSANDAM

The exclave of Musandam is Oman's northernmost governorate, separated from the rest of Oman by the UAE and home to some of the Sultanate's most dramatic landscape. Here, 2000m high mountains meet the sea with stunning fjords and crystal-clear waters making this area one of the best diving and snorkelling spots in the world.

The city of Khasab makes a great base from which to explore the Musandam Peninsula, where you can enjoy the scenery from on the water, starting with a cruise on a traditional Dhow to spot pods of dolphin resting and feeding and continuing with a trip to the surrounding mountains and fjords by 4WD vehicle or mountain bike if you're feeling extra adventurous.





MUSCAT

Muscat is the modern capital of Oman and offers visitors a stunning combination of old and new. From the architectural masterpiece that is the Sultan Qaboos Grand Mosque, to its rugged mountain backdrop and breath-taking beaches, this city never fails to entertain and inspire.

There is an abundance of choice for visitors, from world-class shows at the Royal Opera House Muscat, to fine dining at one of the many restaurants scattered across the capital or shopping for traditional souvenirs at Muttrah Souq, one of the oldest in Arabia.



Although Dhofar lies over 1,000 kilometres from the capital city of Muscat, planning a trip is easy with daily flights between Muscat and Salalah and direct connections from other Arab Gulf states. Those with some spare time may also opt to drive the coastal road to Salalah, traversing through Al Wusta and seeing some of Oman's most remote yet breath-taking beaches.

Oman's southernmost region is host to many unique attractions including Prophet Ayoub's Grave nestled deep in the mountains, the blowholes of Mughsayl and the Land of Frankincense – a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Deep sea diving and snorkelling off the coast of the Hallaniyat Islands are just some of the more adventurous activities available.



THE MODERN CAPITAL OF OMAN








ADVENTURE

From exploring one of the largest cave chambers in the world, Majlis Al Jinn, to snorkelling the colourful coral reefs of Daymaniyat Islands or camping under the stars in the A'Sharqiyah Sands; adventure is at the heart of every journey through Oman.

Thanks to its diverse landscapes, ranging from Rocky Mountains with green terrace fields to bustling souks selling camels on the edge of the desert or watching baby turtles hatch on the beach, the Sultanate welcomes all travellers seeking adventures of a lifetime.



Water Sports

Oman looks back on a proud maritime history, renowned for Dhow building and trading across the seas. As such, Omanis are known to have a special connection with the sea, settling where there are natural harbours and great fishing grounds.



Caving

Home to the second largest cave chamber in the world (Majlis Al Jinn on the Salmah Plateau) and numerous others, the Sultanate has plenty of caves to explore.

Camel Riding

Historically, camels were used by local Bedouins for transporting goods and people through the desert and around the country. Today, owning camels has become more a sign of prestige, with many Omanis breeding them for racing and beauty contests.



Golf has a history in the Sultanate dating back to 1970s. With world-class golf clubs in Muscat – the Al Mouj Golf Club, Muscat Hills Golf and Country Club, Ghala Valley Golf Club, and the Ras Al Hamra Golf Club – perfect golfing weather is usually experienced between September and May, and during the evenings in Summer.





Off-Roading

Many of Oman's stunning attractions are off the beaten track and require a 4WD vehicle. Whether dune bashing in the desert or exploring a wadi, off-roading is one of the best ways to truly experience some of Oman's most exciting areas.

Climbing

From rock climbing to abseiling, Oman offers plenty of stunning spots for more experienced mountaineers. It is recommended to always keep an eye on the weather, wadis and roads can quickly flood in case of rain.



Camping

From the white pebble sand beaches of Fins and Sur, to rocky outcrops above the clouds on Jebel Samham in Dhofar, Oman has hundreds of stunning camping locations for visitors to choose from.



Hiking

Hiking routes can be found throughout the country; from short, accessible routes on the outskirts of cities and villages, to longer treks in more remote areas. Oman has something for every hiker, including some combining elements of canyoning and climbing.



Mountain Biking & Cycling

Cycling and mountain biking has risen in popularity in the Sultanate, with both amateur and professional cyclists appreciating the country for its stunning diverse landscapes and the new challenge that riding in Oman presents.



Paragliding

Paragliding is a newer addition to Oman's rapidly growing adventure tourism scene, adding to an already impressive suite of outdoor pursuits in the country. Several tour companies offer beginner, intermediate, and pilot courses for anyone interested.


Stand up Paddle Boarding

Attractions such as Jebel Shams, or the Ophiolite rocks surrounding Muttrah Corniche, were once at the bottom of the ocean.




Mountains

Mountains take up a large part of Oman's landscape, varying greatly in appearance vegetation. Often times they feature stunning wadis, cut into the mountains through time and crossable only by 4×4.

Beaches

With over 3,000 km of pristine coastline, Oman has some seriously beautiful beaches to call its own. Whether it is the rugged coastline of Ras Al Madrakah, the white sands of Fins Beach or the endless expanse of Masirah Island beaches, visitors are welcome to enjoy beach walks, picnics and wild camping.





Wadis


Wadis are dry riverbeds or small valleys. Some have stunning water pools, fed by natural springs, and a backdrop of rugged mountains. Others are framed by date and fruit plantations that to this day are tended by locals using traditional falaj or waterways.

If you have ever witnessed endangered Green Turtle babies hatch and try to make their way to the water, you will know what a special experience it is. Oman remains dedicated to enabling these kind of wildlife encounters while protecting the animals.



Deserts

The interior of Oman is the gateway to one of the largest sand deserts in the world – the famous Empty Quarter or Rub Al Khali. Covering a large area of the Arabian Peninsula, this unique ecosystem is covered by sand dunes up to 250 metres in heights in certain areas, and salty planes in others.







Oman currently has five UNESCO World Heritage Sites, all of which deserve to be visited first-hand.

Bahla Fort was inscribed as World Heritage Site in 1987 and has since been beautifully restored. The fort reopened to the public in late 2012.

Credited to the Bronze Age (3rd millennium B.C.), the archaeological sites of Bat, Al Khutm and Al Ayn in Ad Dhahirah make up the world's most complete collection of beehive tombs.

In Dhofar, the Land of Frankincense encompasses the frankincense trees of Wadi Dawkah Reserve and the remains of caravan and trading settlements such as Ubar, Khawr Ruri and Al Baleed – highlighting the importance of frankincense for the flourishing trade in the region during ancient times.

This ancient watering method is deeply rooted in Oman's heritage, with over 3000 aflaj – or irrigation systems – still in use today. Using gravity to transport water from springs, the fair management of these waterways plays an important role in communities around the country. Falaj Daris in Nizwa, one of Oman's longest falaj, is still in use today.

The Ancient city of Qalhat in Sur. This site has an exceptional international value for trading between Oman and the ancient world civilizations. Its considered as a distinctive example of the architecture and planning of active port cities in the middle ages.



Dining

Whether it is tasty street food or fine dining, visitors to Oman will find a wide range of options to suit all tastes. From contemporary restaurants serving all types of international cuisine in hotels, resorts, malls and commercial areas, to the casual shawarma eateries and coffee shops, the possibilities are endless.



In centuries past, Oman's forts held enemy forces at bay. Today, these historic structures welcome guests with impressive facades that continue to stand proud and have become a living testament to the ingenuity and craftsmanship of the period.



Oman has a number of museums, primarily in the capital area, that is focused on promoting culture, science, and heritage.



Heritage & Crafts

Oman has always placed great importance on the preservation of its heritage and traditional craftsmanship.

Handed down through generations, craftwork is still practiced according to old traditions and with a modern twist by Omani artisans across the Sultanate.




Arts & Entertainment

Most larger settlements in Oman have their own soug, the most famous being Muttrah Soug, situated on the Old Muscat waterfront and selling everything from clothes, to silver, spices, Frankincense and more.





Day 01: Muscat - The Capital

Start the trip with one night in Oman's capital, Muscat. A great place to explore on foot due to the concentration of shops, restaurants and historical landmarks in the small downtown area. Enjoy a guided tour of the opulent Grand Mosque, the interesting Bait Al Zubair Musuem and colourful Muttrah Souq.

Day 02 - 03: Wahiba Sands

Today, you will be driven to the coastal town of Sur, known in the past as a major trading port, conjuring images of traditional Arabian dhows of the yesteryears. Along the way, the sceneries of the Eastern Hajar Mountains and white beaches keep you entertained.

Optional: For wildlife lovers, we recommend to spend one or two nights in Sur's Ras Al Jinz Turtle Reserve, where you can observe the nesting process of the endangered Green Sea Turtles, who come on shore to lay hundreds of eggs during the night.

From Sur, continue to head into desert to spend an unforgettable two nights under the crystal-clear night skies. While in Wahiba Sands, you will enjoy sightseeing trip to the turqouise oasis of Wadi Bani Khalid with its palm-shaded pools, as well as 4WD adventure on the dunes.

Day 04 - 05: Nizwa

From the desert you transfer by road to the ancient city of Nizwa. Along the way, you make a stop at picturesque medieval villages, including the charming mountain village of Misfat Al Abriyeen

Nizwa is also known for its historical fort and souq. Your guide will also be able to show you where you will find traditional Omani architecture, the impressive Jabrin Castle and more.

On your last full day you will have free morning at leisure to fully breathe in the beauty of the mountainous region of Jabal Akhdar, the highest in the Arabian peninsula.

For the more adventurous, the mountains also offer plenty of opportunity for hiking and mountain biking to soak up the spectacular views down into the gorges and across sharp peaks, which we can help you arrange at additional cost.



Day 01 - 02: Muscat - The Capital

You will be met on arrival at Muscat Airport by your driver who will whisk you to your accommodation for the next two nights.

Muscat, Oman's port capital, sits on the Gulf of Oman surrounded by mountains and desert. With history dating back to antiquity, it mixes high-rises and upscale shopping malls with clifftop landmarks such as the 16th-century Portuguese forts, Al Jalali and Mirani, looming over Muscat Harbor.

Its modern, marble-clad Sultan Qaboos Grand Mosque, with 50m dome and prodigious Persian carpet, can accommodate 20,000 people.

Day 03: Wahiba Sands

You will leave Muscat behind travelling down the beautiful Eastern Coastal Route. Although you can drive to the desert in just 3 hours we recommend taking this route to see some of the beauty of Oman's breath taking coastline. You will have the opportunity to stop at the Bimmah Sinkhole, see powder white beaches and explore wadis on the way.

As you leave the coast behind you will drive into Wahiba Sands and your driver will drive you across this vast area where you can see nothing but sand dunes, some as high as 200 metres.

Day 04 - 05: Nizwa

As you leave your camp behind you can stop at a Bedouin house and meet a Bedouin family. Although many now have houses in the city some Bedouin still prefer to stay in the desert and care for their animals as their ancestors did before them. Known for their knowledge of the desert and their hospitality you will be offered tea or Arabic coffee and have the opportunity to talk about this unique way of life and how it fits into modern Oman.

Day 06 - 07: Hajar Mountains

The mountains surrounding Nizwa are perfect for adventure enthusiasts, with some excellent opportunities for trekking and mountain biking. There are options to suit all fitness levels, from easy going strolls to strenuous full-day adventures. Staying at the View which overlooks the village of Al Hamra is an ideal base to explore the canyons and mountains and wadis.

Salmiya



While officially being the biggest mosque in the country, the Grand Mosque is renowned for having big celebrations, and other religious events here. Covering about 46000 square meters, the mosque is a fine example of the Islamic architectural style and attracts visitors pretty much due to its Persian structural design.



Kuwait Towers

Another of those Kuwait city attractions to visit, Kuwait Towers are a group of three towers that stand at a staggering height and are one of the major attractions in Kuwait. For visitors coming to see the towers, the main tower stands at an approximate height of 187 meters while the second tower stands at a height of 147 meters. Besides, speaking about the third one, the third tower features equipment that is there to illuminate the two towers.

Kuwait's Green Island

Green Island is the only artificial island in the region. It is found off the coast of Kuwait City's promenade and is another popular landmark of the city. This is because the island offers a retreat from city life, even if just for an afternoon.

The entire family will enjoy the soft, sandy beaches where one can play any sports or games. There is a swimming pool located on the island and kid-friendly attractions. For those who want to get active, biking and walking trails are aplenty.



House of Mirrors

The house of mirrors is owned by an Italian born Lidia Al Qattan, a sculptor, painter, jeweler and her family. This place has an interesting story to narrate, which entails Jalila, her daughter had once broken a mirror and turning a blind eye to superstitious about broken mirrors, Lidia wanted to something artistic with the glass shards. The hosts are friendly and welcoming even though the visits are appointment basis. It is not something people should miss and can't be missed because of the glitter that surrounds the building.





National Museum & Planetarium

Designed by French Architect Michel Ecochard and a place that truly represents Kuwaiti Heritage, the National Museum is one of the top Kuwait tourist attractions today and was the former residence of the royal Al Subah family. The museum has three main sections like Archaeology, Heritage, and the Planetarium. One can visit here and find the most amazing collection from the Failika Island. Interestingly, the Failika Island dates back to the Bronze Age.

Ferry to Failaka Island

Failaka Island is a Kuwaiti Island located 20 kilometres off the coast of Kuwait city in the Persian Gulf.

Many settlements on Failaka can be traced back to 2000 B.C. and great civilizations such as the Mesopotamians, Babylonians, and ancient Greeks have passed through the territory, making the island the center of archeology in Kuwait.



Diving around Kubbar Island

Located 29 kilometres south of Failaka, this much smaller island is nearly a perfect circle, completely coated in sand, and home to various species of birds, including flamingos, which stop over on the island during their annual migration.

Kubbar is most famous for the spectacular coral reefs which surround the island, and is consequently a popular spot for scuba diving and other water sports.

Doha Village Entertainment City

Those traveling to Kuwait with children shouldn't leave the country without paying a visit to the Al-Doha district in northern Kuwait, 20 kilometers north of the capital.

Formerly a district known for fishing and traditional boat-building, the area is now home to Entertainment City, a theme park considered the equivalent of a Kuwaiti Disneyland.



Tareq Rajab Museum

The museum is filled with Kuwait's first minister Tareq Sayyed Rajab and his British wife, Jehan Wellborne personal collection. Submerged in history, one will easily get transported back into time in the museum situated in the basement of a villa in Jabriya.

It is one of Kuwait's famous places filled with an amazing collection of Islamic Arts, ceramics, gold and silver jewelry, metal and glass works, costumes, pottery, Bahraini pearls, manuscripts and musical instruments.



Liberation Tower

Liberation tower is one the most popular symbols of Kuwait's liberation, which has been named after the liberation of the country from annexation by Iraq which was the multinational coalition. It is made with ceramic tiles and along with the telecommunication office, it has a revolving restaurant and an observation platform. Tourists should visit the tower for its historical importance.

Al Sadu House

A different museum from the others, A Sada House has a gorgeous collection of artifacts and antiques. Once upon a time, it used to be a traditional Kuwaiti house nestled close to the national museum on Gulf road. At present, it is an interesting museum that boasts a bedouin style of weaving. It was made to preserve the bedouin crafts and has rooms that present the traditional weaving techniques and their history.



Sief Palace

Another of those top places to visit in Kuwait, the Seif Palace is located just opposite the amazing Grand Mosque and offers some amazing highlights to the visitors. Made from clay, rocks, limestone, and other such materials, this is a place that is perfect in terms of reliving the historical past of Kuwait. The main highlight of the palace is the watchtower. Interestingly, the watchtower has the most eye-catching design of all



Beaches

Kuwait is blessed with a gorgeous coastline as the Azure waters and white sand are absolutely breathtaking. Tourists can relax by the waters, sun bathe and enjoy the cool sea breeze or enjoy the various kinds of water sports.

What more can one say? One of the best places to visit in Kuwait is the AL Kout beach, known for its serenity of the sands and peaceful blue waters. It attracts tourists from all over the world every year.

House of National Works

One of the most prominent places to visit in the country, this memorial museum takes one back to the period of the first Gulf War in 1990-91. American Cultural Center








MUSEUMS

BAHRAIN NATIONAL MUSEUM

The Bahrain National Museum is the crowning achievement of the Kingdom of Bahrain's ongoing efforts to preserve the nation's heritage and history; Efforts which began in 1957 when the first exhibition of the artefacts discovered by the Danish archaeological expedition was held at Al-Hidaya Al-Khalifiya in Muharraq.






FORT & MUSEUM

Known as Dilmun in ancient times, Bahrain's rich trading history is reflected in numerous archaeological sites, the most fascinating of which is the Bahrain Fort site that is registered as a UNESCO World Heritage site.

The fort is located atop a 17.5 hectare artificial hill that has been built over more than 4000 years of continuous occupation. It is the site of the former capital of Dilmun and one of the most archaeological sites in the Arabian Gulf.

The excavations over the past 50 years have revealed residential, public, commercial and military structures that testify to the importance of the site over the centuries. These findings are brought to life by an audio guide available at the site museum.





SHEIKH SALMAN BIN AHMED AL FATEH

Sheikh Salman bin Ahmed Al-Fateh Fort, commonly known as Riffa Fort due to its location in Riffa, is an historic landmark and stands witness to one of the most important junctures in Bahrain's history. Within its beautiful architecture lives the memory of the ruling family of Bahrain, the Al Khalifas.

A series of programs organized by the Ministry of Culture have brought life back to the fort and not only present a chronological history of the Al Khalifa family but showcase the interior space designed by the French firm, La Meduse and the local engineering firm, PAD, which took its inspiration from the fort's history and people.



AL FATEH GRAND MOSQUE

The Al-Fateh Mosque is one of the largest mosques in the world, encompassing 6,500 square meters and having the capacity to accommodate over 7,000 worshippers at a time.

The mosque was built by the late Sheikh Isa bin Salman Al Khalifa in 1987 and was named after Ahmed Al Fateh.







Housed in a spectacular Arabic script engraved building, this distinguished museum showcases a significant collection of Quranic manuscripts and scriptures dating back to the 7th century.

Many copies of the Quran you will see are works of art in themselves. Some miniature copies can fit in the palm of the hand and Quranic verses have even been inscribed on a grain of rice.

In addition to its important historical collection, Bait al Quran exhibition space often hosts varied art exhibitions while housing a small mosque, distinguished library and learning environment for Islamic teaching.

Bahrain is an Arabic word meaning "Two Seas" and refers to the two sources of water surrounding the islands, fresh water springs and the surrounding seas. 

Things to Know

While standards vary from country to country the Middle East is culturally defined by being predominantly Islamic, and by most of its countries being ruled under Islamic law.

This means that we need to be aware of a few things about customs and culture if we want to avoid drawing unwanted attention on the street or possibly even from the government. Additionally, recent conflicts mean that travelers should take extra precautions when traveling through high-risk areas.

Dress code

Just about everyone is aware that women dress very conservatively in the Middle East and don't interact with men if they can help it. Depending on the country it would be considered unseemly to even be walking in the street without a man. Few people seem to be aware that this is often also expected of visitors.

Showing up in a crop top and shorts is less of a daring stand for women's rights than it is extremely disrespectful, dangerous, and even illegal if you decided to do something like that in the wrong country. Some places like Saudi Arabia require visitors to be "fully dressed" meaning everything including the face must be covered.

Others like Turkey are lax and fairly secularized, and still others like Oman are conservative but don't expect visitors to conform to their standards.

Behavior in Public

Men and women shouldn't interact in public in more conservative countries. Doing so is considered disrespectful and can result in harassment on the street.

During the month of Ramadan, it can be considered rude to eat in public. This is partly because it's disrespectful to the religion and partly just because it's cruel to waft delicious edibles in front of someone who is incredibly hungry. You can eat inside or join in the fast and join the party in the evening when the feasting happens. It's quite the experience and well worth the effort of making some local friends.

Address people formally

We pride ourselves on our informality & easygoing attitude. This does not apply in the Middle East. Address people by their title and last name.

Don't use their first name unless you are explicitly permitted to do so. Also, don't do hugs, affectionate slaps on the shoulder, high fives, or any other "chill" quintessentially American greeting unless you know for certain that it will be well received. A firm handshake will get you a lot further.

Watch what you're taking pictures of

A lot of Middle Eastern governments like Syria, Saudi Arabia, or Yemen are not incredibly trusting of Americans snapping pictures of military facilities. If you're not sure what a building is for it is better not to pull out your camera.

Usually, the most interesting architecture will be mosques, monuments, or works of art anyway, so don't invite trouble where you can avoid it. If someone catches you the trouble could be as minor as getting you to delete the picture, to taking your camera, to taking you to jail for questioning.

Middle East Accommodation

Middle East accommodation can range from basic and budget to plush and palatial, however most accommodation sits nicely somewhere in the middle of that scale. Perhaps one of the most exciting places when it comes to Middle East accommodation is Dubai.

Home to one of the world's most incredible hospitality industries, Dubai is famous for its luxury and high end accommodation with a huge range of 4 and 5 star hotels as well as the world's only 7 star hotel. Despite its reputation for opulence, there are still a great range of accommodation options for those not wanting to splash some cash.

Middle East Facts

The Middle East holds approximately two thirds of the world's global oil reserves which equates to roughly 1 trillion barrels of oil. Although Arabic, Turkish, and Persian are the main languages spoken in the Middle East, you may be surprised to learn that English is quite common. It is spoken by much of the population in Egypt, Jordan, Israel, Bahrain and United Arab Emirates. Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon, Syria, Morocco, Tunisia, and Turkey all have their own national beers. The United Arab Emirates has less crime than the U.S., Canada, Germany, Britain, New Zealand or Australia. One of the world's best-preserved Roman temples is in Lebanon.

Crossing borders overland? How's the political relationship between those two countries

Entering a country overland can be a completely different experience than flying in.

Visa requirements might be different as airports might give visas on arrival while land borders might require you to get a visa beforehand from the nearest embassy or consulate. Additionally, how is the political relationship between those two countries? Is the border open for crossing? If it is, how complicated or time-consuming is the crossing? As an example, the border between Israel and Lebanon has been closed for decades, so if you wish to travel between those two countries, you will need to fly from Israel to a third country, and then on to Lebanon.

How stable is the country, politically, at the moment?

Unfortunately, the Middle East has had an unstable and somewhat volatile political relationship not only within itself but also with other western countries, mostly in Europe and North America. Relationships can go from friendly to accusatory, and vice-versa, in a matter of days, so it's always good to have a close eye on the local politics of each country you intend to visit, especially if they haven't had the most stable government in recent years.

Countries like Jordan, Qatar, Bahrain, Lebanon, Oman, United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia and even Iran have been stable and peaceful for years now. Israel and Palestine are somewhat in a grey area, where it's pretty safe to visit them, but their relationship is tense. On the opposite end, we have Syria, Iraq (not counting Iraqi Kurdistan), and Yemen, which are countries that should be avoided for now.

Do you need a visa? Can you get it on your own?

From experience, we can say people in the Middle East are extremely friendly, and in general, they don't have any animosity against foreigners, including Americans. Having said that, governments do not necessarily represent their people, and some governments make it incredibly hard for foreigners, especially Americans and British, to get a visa.

Is it Ramadan?

Ramadan is the ninth month of the Muslim year, when Muslims practice strict fasting from sunrise to sunset, abstain from pleasures and pray to become closer to God. It is an exciting holiday to experience, but keep in mind that many sights, activities, restaurants, and cafes close down to respect Ramadan. "You can travel in the region during Ramadan, but you might need to search more for certain experiences and eateries as options might be limited from sunrise to sunset. The exact dates of Ramadan vary per year, as it's based on a lunar calendar, but usually falls between April and May.

Tips - On the go

BAGGAGE REGULATIONS AND SOME RECOMMENDATIONS

- · Make sure you check the baggage allowance on your international / internal flights.
- · We recommend to travel light especially when there is internal flight involved in the program due to baggage weight limitation.

- · Please ensure that you do not place any valuables in your check in bag. Carry foreign currency / travel documents / jewellery / insurance in your hand bag.

- · Since travelling distances are comparatively long, we have carefully chosen air conditioned luxurious coaches for your convenience luxurious coaches for your convenience and comfort. It is very important to maintain a pleasant environment on board the coach and keep it clean.
- · Drinking, Smoking and eating is not allowed in the coach.

MEALS

· You have a choice of local and international cuisine meals. The menus, however are fixed in advance and a la carte is also possible upon request.

- · Most lunches and dinner are unlimited buffets, but it is requested that you do not waste food.
- · If there is any early morning departure to the airport a box breakfast may be provided.
- · Some cities you may be served local meals.

CLIMATE

- The climate is as varied as its countries, but it is mostly temperate.
- · Frequent changes of weather make forecasting difficult. To be on the safe side, be sure to bring a sweater and an umbrella with you.

HOTELS & ROOMS

- · Most hotels offer the facility of complimentary safe deposit lockers (few hotels charge a refundable deposit. we advice that you keep all your valuable like money, passport, tickets and jewellery in the locker, in case you are staying for more than one day at the hotel.
- · Please make sure that no damages are done to your hotel room during the stay, as the same would be charged to you directly by the hotel.
- · Hotel rooms may have facilities like mini bar, pay television channels, telephones, etc. please note that these facilities are not complimentary and will be charged as per actual usage.
- · Most of the hotels do not have a tea/ coffee kettle in the rooms.
- · Please note that we will try our best to provide you with adjacent rooms asked by you at the time of booking, but the same will be subject to availability at the time of check –in. It is also difficult to provide interconnecting rooms, however the tour manager and the hotel will try their best to ensure that you are provided with adjacent rooms wherever possible.
- The standard check in time at hotels is after 14:00 HRS and standard check –out time is 10:00 HRS.

TIME MANAGEMENT

MONEY AND CURRENCY


· EURO and USD are widely accepted and can be exchanged to any major currency exchange counter. it is better to carry USD before you start your trip.


TIPPING POLICY
